Two Applicants Compete for Dialysis Stations in Guilford County

RALEIGH — Two applicants have filed certificate of need applications with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services to relocate dialysis stations to Guilford County.

Bio-Medical Applications of North Carolina Inc. proposes to relocate 12 dialysis stations from BMA Burlington in Alamance County to BMA of South Greensboro in Greensboro.

Total Renal Care of North Carolina LLC proposes to develop a 10-station dialysis facility and a home training and support program in Greensboro by relocating 7 dialysis stations from Reidsville Dialysis in Rockingham County and 3 dialysis stations from Burlington Dialysis in Alamance County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held Sept. 20 at 11 a.m. in the John H. McAdoo Conference Room, 3rd floor, BB&T Building, 201 W. Market St., Greensboro.

Anyone may file written comments concerning this proposal. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Sept. 3.
