RE: Proposed Temporary Adoption of Radiation Protection Rules

GS 150B-21.1 requires a rule-making body to notify certain individuals of its intent to publish a temporary rule on the Office of Administrative Hearings website. It also requires notification of the date, time and location of the public hearing on the rules.

The N.C. Radiation Protection Commission has submitted form OAH 0500 to the Codifier of Rules, Office of Administrative Hearings, indicating its intent to adopt the following rule:

10A NCAC 15 .1801

The public hearing is scheduled for December 7, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 104, Brown Building, 801 Biggs Drive, Raleigh, NC 27603. The building is located in the Dorothea Dix Park. Ms. Taylor Corpening, DHSR Rule-Review Manager, is accepting public comments on this rule from November 27, 2023 – December 18, 2023. Comments can also be made at the public hearing. The proposed effective date of this rule is February 23, 2024.

3	SECTION .1800 – STANDARDS FOR RADON PROFICIENCY PROGRAM APPROVAL

5	10A NCAC 15.1801 REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION OF RADON PROFICIENCY			
6	PROGRAMS			
7	(a) No person shall offer services as a radon proficiency program unless registered with the Department.			
8	(b) In addition to the definitions found in Rule .0104 of this Chapter, the following definition shall apply to this Rule:			
9	"Radon proficiency program" means an organization that provides training, competency testing, and certification to			
10	an individual as a radon professional.			
11	(c) Persons seeking initial registration, to amend a registration, or to renew a registration as a radon proficiency			
12	program shall:			
13	(1) submit an application for registration to the agency at the addresses shown in Rule .0111(a) of this			
14	Chapter or as otherwise instructed by the agency. Applications for initial registration and			
15	applications to renew a registration shall be submitted with supporting information demonstrating			
16 17	that the requirements of Paragraph (d) of this Rule and S.L. 2023-91, s.2 are met. Applications to			
17	amend a registration shall be submitted with an attachment explaining the items to be amended; and			
18 19	(2) comply with the provisions of Paragraph (i) of this Rule.			
20	(d) The Department shall approve an application for initial registration or to renew a registration as a radon proficiency			
20	program that meets the criteria set out in S.L. 2023-91, s.2. (e) Radon proficiency program registrations issued by the Department shall expire at midnight on the expiration date			
21	stated on the radon proficiency program registration. The Department shall not issue an initial or renewed registration			
22	expiring less than one year from the date of issuance.			
23	(f) The Department shall deny an application for initial registration or to renew a registration as a radon proficiency			
25	program if the application fails to demonstrate compliance with Paragraph (d) of this Rule and S.L. 2023-91, s.2.			
26	(g) Persons whose radon proficiency program registrations are revoked or expired may apply for registration in			
27	accordance with Paragraph (c) of this Rule and S.L. 2023-91, s.2 and shall not offer services as a radon proficiency			
28	program with a revoked or expired registration.			
29	(h) Each registrant shall, upon notice of at least 48 hours, make available to the Department for inspection records			
30	maintained pursuant to this Rule.			
31	(i) Applications submitted to the Department for registration as a radon proficiency program shall contain the			
32	following information:			
33	(1) Box 1, check the box next to the type of registration requested;			
34	(2) Box 2, business physical address:			
35	(A) name of the radiation proficiency program;			
36	(B) phone number at the physical location;			
37	(C) website associated with the radiation proficiency program;			

1		<u>(D)</u>	physical address of the business, including the street address, city, county, state, and zip	
2			code. The five digit zip code may be used if the nine digit zip code is not known;	
3		<u>(E)</u>	mailing address if different from Box 1. If the physical and mailing addresses are the same,	
4			the mailing address may be left blank: Mailing address of the business, including city, state,	
5			and zip code. The five digit zip code may be used if the nine digit zip code is not known;	
6			and	
7		<u>(F)</u>	name, phone number and email for the individual completing the form.	
8	(3)	Box 3, a	uthorizing signature of individual responsible for the radon proficiency program:	
9		<u>(A)</u>	name of company or corporate office;	
10		(B)	full legal name. Middle initials may be used in lieu of the full middle name; and	
11		<u>(C)</u>	signature of the individual registering the radiation proficiency program on behalf of the	
12			business; and	
13	(4)	Addition	al Attachments to include with application:	
14		<u>(A)</u>	documents establishing compliance and periodic reaccreditation with the international	
15			program approval standard through accreditation by a recognized accreditation body or	
16			demonstration of current approval by the United States Environmental Protection Agency	
17			as a radon proficiency program;	
18		<u>(B)</u>	list of a board members from various private and public sector stakeholders to make	
19			decisions regarding curriculum, testing, instructor qualifications, quality assurance and	
20			control, continuing education requirements, and procedures for the handling of complaints;	
21		<u>(C)</u>	minimum training requirements for radon professionals for each type of certification	
22			offered;	
23		<u>(D)</u>	examination requirements for each type of certification;	
24		<u>(E)</u>	continuing education requirements for each type of certification; and	
25		<u>(F)</u>	instructor names and qualifications demonstrating relevant knowledge and experience.
