Common Routes of Medication Administration

- Oral taken by the mouth and swallowed
- Buccal placed between cheek and gum
- Sublingual placed under the tongue
- **Eye** placed in the pocket of the eye created when the lower eyelid is gently pulled down
- Ear placed in the ear canal created when the external ear is pulled up and back
- Nasal placed in the nostril
- Inhalant inhaled into the lungs
- Transdermal placed and affixed to the skin
- **Topical** applied to the skin or hair
- Vaginal inserted into the vagina
- **Rectal** inserted into the rectum
- **Subcutaneous** injected into the fat with a syringe
