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Two compete for 10 renal dialysis stations in Randolph County

RALEIGH – Two applicants have filed competing proposals with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop 10 renal dialysis stations in Randolph County.

A public hearing for these competing projects will be held at 11 a.m. on Nov. 16 in the Commissioners Meeting Room in the Randolph County Office Building at 725 McDowell Road in Asheboro.

The July 2010 North Carolina Semi-annual Dialysis Report identified a need for 10 renal dialysis stations in Randolph County. The two applicants proposing to develop the 10 stations in Randolph County are:

- Bio-Medical Applications of North Carolina, Inc. d/b/a BMA Asheboro proposes to relocate the 36-station facility and add 10 stations. The project is expected to cost \$2.6 million and to be complete by June 2012.
- Total Renal Care of North Carolina, LLC d/b/a Randolph County Dialysis proposes to develop a 10-station facility. The project is expected to cost \$1.4 million and to be complete by June 2012.
