Seven compete to develop Medicare-certified home health agency in Brunswick County

RALEIGH – Seven companies filed competing applications with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop a Medicare-certified home health agency in Brunswick County. There is a need determination in the 2013 State Medical Facilities Plan for one Medicare-certified home health agency in Brunswick County.

A public hearing for these competing projects will be held at 10 a.m. on June 20 in Courtroom 2 in the Brunswick County Courthouse, Building S, 310 Government Center Drive, Bolivia. The projects are described as:

- UniHealth Home Health proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$318,967 and to be complete in January 2015.
- NHRMC Home Care proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$80,190 and to be complete in April, 2015.
- Advance Home Care proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$70,000 and to be complete in February 2014.
- HealthKeeperz of Brunswick proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$62,400 and to be complete in October 2014.
- Maxim Healthcare Services, Inc. proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$90,000 and to be complete in July 2014.
- Gentiva Health Services proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$107,500 and to be complete in April 2014.
- Continuum Home Care of Brunswick County proposes to develop a home health agency that is expected to cost \$102,200 and to be complete in October 2014.
