Two compete for fixed MRI scanner in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH – Two applicants have filed competing proposals with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to acquire a fixed MRI scanner in Mecklenburg County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held at 10:00 a.m. on July 18 in Room 240 of Carolinas College of Health Sciences, 1200 Blythe Boulevard, Charlotte, N.C.

The 2014 State Medical Facilities Plan has identified a need for one additional fixed MRI scanner in HSA III, which includes Mecklenburg, Cabarrus, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Rowan, Stanly and Union counties. Each proposal seeks to acquire a fixed MRI scanner to be located in Mecklenburg County. The proposals are described as follows:

- OrthoCarolina Ballantyne proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner at 15825 John J. Delaney Drive, Charlotte, N.C. The project is expected to cost \$2.4 million and to be completed in January 2016.
- Novant Health Mint Hill Medical Center proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at 12325 Albemarle Road, Charlotte, N.C. The project is expected to cost \$2.4 million and to be completed in January 2018.
