PUBLIC NOTICE

Seven Applicants Compete for Fixed PET Scanner

RALEIGH — Seven applicants have filed certificate of need applications with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services to acquire a fixed PET scanner in response to a need determination in the 2025 State Medical Facilities Plan for two fixed PET scanners in Health Service Area IV.

The projects are as follows:

- Duke University Hospital proposes to develop one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$500,000 and would be completed in October 2025.
- Duke Cary Hospital proposes to develop one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$7.1 million and would be completed in July 2029.
- University of North Carolina Medical Center proposes to develop one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$4.2 million and would be completed in July 2026.
- Wake Radiology UNC REX Healthcare-Garner proposes to develop one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$3.7 million and would be completed in October 2026.
- Durham Diagnostic Imaging – Independence Park proposes to develop one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$12.9 million and would be completed in October 2026.
- Associated Urologists of North Carolina proposes to develop a diagnostic center (Raleigh PET Imaging) by acquiring one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$3.1 million and would be completed in July 2026.
- WakeMed Raleigh Medical Park proposes to develop one fixed PET scanner. The project is expected to cost \$4.2 million and would be completed in October 2027.

A public hearing for these projects will be held April 17 at 10 a.m. in conference room 26 of the Edgerton Building on the Dorothea Dix Campus, 809 Ruggles Drive in Raleigh.
