Dear Ms. Hanger:

The Certificate of Need Section (CON Section) received your letter of July 9, 2014 regarding the above referenced proposal. Based on the CON law in effect on the date of this response to your request, the proposal described in your correspondence is not governed by, and therefore, does not currently require a certificate of need. However, please note that if the CON law is subsequently amended such that the above referenced proposal would require a certificate of need, this determination does not authorize you to proceed to develop the above referenced proposal when the new law becomes effective.

Moreover, you need to contact the Acute and Home Care Licensure and Certification Section, Division of Health Service Regulation to determine if they have any requirements for development of the proposed project.

It should be noted that this determination is binding only for the facts represented by you. Consequently, if changes are made in the project or in the facts provided in your correspondence referenced above, a new determination as to whether a certificate of need is required would need to be made by the Certificate of Need Section. Changes in a project include, but are not limited to: (1) increases in the capital cost; (2) acquisition of medical equipment not included in the original cost estimate; (3) modifications in the design of the project; (4) change in location; and (5) any increase in the number of square feet to be constructed.



Dear Ms. Frisone and Ms. Thorne-Williams:

We are writing you on behalf of our client, Greater Gaston Center, LLC ("GGC"), a North Carolina limited liability company. The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Service Regulation, Certificate of Need Section (the "CON Section") issued a certificate of need ("CON") allowing GGC to develop an ambulatory surgical facility with no more than two gastrointestinal endoscopy rooms in Gaston County (Project I.D. # F-8602-10) effective January 8, 2014.

GGC has determined that it is in its best interest to undergo a corporate reorganization effective July 2, 2014. The name of the reorganized entity is Greater Gaston Endoscopy Center, LLC. Besides the new name, the only other changes occurring during the reorganization are the realignment of minority interests held by certain members. The identities of the members have not changed, and no member has acquired a majority interest as a result of the reorganization. Enclosed as <u>Exhibit A</u> is the Amendment to the Articles of Organization documenting the changes made during the corporate reorganization.

Pursuant to 10A NCAC 14C.0502(b)(1), the ownership of a CON is not transferred when "the holder of the certificate is a corporation and the identity of the holder changes because of a corporate reorganization." Further, the realignment of minority interests in the facility does not result in the transfer of a CON; instead, control is only transferred by a realignment of ownership interests "when any person acquires a majority interest in the facility, project or holder or any parent entity of the facility, project or holder." 10A NCAC 14C.0502(c).

Here, GGC's name has changed due to corporate reorganization. All of the members of the limited liability company remain the same, and no member has acquired a majority interest in the company due to the reorganization.

In addition, reorganizations of existing health services have long been deemed exempt from CON review. For example, by a letter dated June 6, 1996, the CON Section determined that the reorganization of Hospice of Cabarrus County, Inc. to establish Hospice of Cabarrus County, Inc. as a controlled affiliate

of Cabarrus Memorial Hospital, Inc. Likewise, the CON Section issued a no review letter dated April 12, 2002 stating that the corporate reorganization of Mariner Post-Acute Care Network into Mariner Health Care, Inc. was not regulated under the Certificate of Need Law and thus did not require a CON. Further, the CON Section has even found that the acquisition of a 50% interest in a part owner of an existing health care provider by a third party was exempt from CON requirements in a June 25, 1998 no review letter regarding the acquisition of a 50% interest in Diagnostic Radiology Imaging, LLC by Radiology Imaging Partners, LLC in Guilford County. In comparison, the changes here are much less -- only the amount of some of the existing owners' minority interests have changed.

Based upon this information, we request that you confirm in writing that GGC's reorganization does not result in the transfer of ownership of the CON for Project I.D. F-8602-10.
