The Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section, Division of Health Service Regulation (Agency), determined that based on your letter of November 11, 2015, the above referenced proposal is exempt from certificate of need review in accordance with G.S 131E-184(g). Therefore, you may proceed to offer, develop or establish the above referenced project without a certificate of need.

However, you need to contact the Agency's Construction and Acute and Home Care Licensure and Certification Sections to determine if they have any requirements for development of the proposed project.

It should be noted that this determination is binding only for the facts represented by you. Consequently, if changes are made in the project or in the facts provided in your correspondence referenced above, a new determination as to whether a certificate of need is required would need to be made by the Agency. RE: Request for Exemption from Review to Renovate Cardiovascular Recovery Unit and Related Space at The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hospital Authority d/b/a Carolinas Medical Center (CMC)

Dear Ms. Frisone:

I am writing to inform you of Carolinas Medical Center's plan to renovate its Cardiovascular Recovery Unit (CVRU) and related space.

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 131E-184(g), "[t]he Department shall exempt from certificate of need review any capital expenditure that exceeds the two million dollar (\$2,000,000) threshold set forth in G.S. 131E-176(16)b. if any of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to renovate, replace on the same site, or expand the entirety or a portion of an existing health service facility that is located on the main campus.
- (2) The capital expenditure does not result in (i) a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or (ii) the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed in G.S. 131E-176(16)b.
- (3) The licensed health service facility proposing to incur the capital expenditure shall provide written notice to the Department along with support documentation to demonstrate that it meets the exemption criteria of this subsection."

N.C.G.S. 131E-176(14n) states "'Main campus' means all of the following for the purposes of G.S. 131E-184(f) and (g) only:

- a. The site of the main building from which a licensed health service facility provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility, including the buildings and grounds adjacent to that main building.
- b. Other areas and structures that are not strictly contiguous to the main building but are located within 250 yards of the main building."

The Carolinas Medical Center CVRU renovation project meets each of the applicable conditions set forth above. The estimated total capital cost of the project exceeds \$2,000,000 (see Exhibit 1 for a capital cost worksheet and a certified construction cost estimate). The proposed project involves the renovation of an existing health service facility located at 1000 Blythe Boulevard, Charlotte, NC 28203, which is the site from which Carolinas Medical Center provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility (see Exhibit 2). Carolinas Medical Center's President's office is located on the second floor of the main hospital building. Please see a copy of Carolinas Medical Center's license in Exhibit 3.

The project consists of renovation only and does not involve a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or the addition of a health service facility or a new institutional health service. The project will not increase the number of operating rooms or gastrointestinal rooms. The project will not result in the acquisition of major medical equipment or the offering of health services not currently provided.

The project involves the renovation of space on the 4th and 6th floors of Carolinas Medical Center. All of the space is associated with the Sanger Heart & Vascular Institute (SHVI), the home for cardiovascular services at Carolinas Medical Center.

6th Floor Renovations

The CVRU is located on the 6th floor of Carolinas Medical Center and provides recovery services to cardiovascular surgery patients including short-term stays of four to six hours in unlicensed recovery spaces and 24 to 48 hour stays in licensed acute care beds. The 6th floor renovations will enhance the physical space and services of the unit.

The CVRU currently includes four licensed intensive care unit (ICU) acute care beds as highlighted in blue on the Level 6 Enlarged Plan-Existing in Exhibit 4. As part of the CVRU renovation, three existing acute care beds currently designated as medical/surgical will be re-designated as CVRU ICU acute care beds; however, the total number of licensed beds at Carolinas Medical Center will not change. Please see the seven proposed ICU acute care beds highlighted in blue on the Level 6 Enlarged Plan-Proposed in Exhibit 4. The re-designation of acute care beds does not constitute a new institutional health service or a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5). Please see Exhibit 5 for an exemption request recently approved by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section which included the re-designation of acute care beds as shown in the statement on page 2 of the original request:

(2) New Institutional Health Services

This project will not change Duke's existing bed capacity, nor include any other new institutional health services. As part of the PCICU relocation, three existing beds currently designated for other purposes will be redesignated as PCICU beds, so that the relocated unit will include 16 beds staffed for PCICU patients; however, the total licensed bed complement will not change.

4th Floor Renovations

As part of the proposed project, SHVI space on the 4th floor will also be renovated as shown on the Level 4 Enlarged Plan-Existing and Level 4 Enlarged Plan-Proposed drawings in Exhibit 4. A staff team room, currently located within the CVRU on the 6th floor, will be relocated to existing space on the 4th floor. A doorway will be renovated to better accommodate patient transport. Finally, on-call and education rooms will be renovated in existing space.

Summary

Based on the above facts, the project is exempt from certificate of need review. We are requesting that you confirm in writing that Carolinas Medical Center's CVRU renovation is exempt from certificate of need review and that we may proceed as planned with this project.




Level 06 Floor Plan - Existing











Re: Exempt Renovation Project at Duke University Hospital

Dear Ms. Frisone:

The purpose of this letter is to provide notice of renovations at Duke University Hospital and to request confirmation that these renovations are exempt from certificate of need review. The project includes renovation of space within Duke North to accommodate licensed pediatric beds, including the relocation of the Pediatric Cardiac Intensive Care Unit. The total projected cost exceeds \$2,000,000.

Section 131E-184(g) provides that "The Department shall exempt from certificate of need review any capital expenditure that exceeds the two million dollar (\$2,000,000) threshold set forth in G.S. 131E-176(16)b. if all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to renovate, replace on the same site, or expand the entirety or a portion of an existing health service facility that is located on the main campus.
- (2) The capital expenditure does not result in (i) a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or (ii) the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed in G.S. 131E-176(16)b.
- (3) The licensed health service facility proposing to incur the capital expenditure shall provide prior written notice to the Department, along with supporting G.S. 131E-184 documentation to demonstrate that it meets the exemption criteria of this subsection."

As set forth below, we believe that Duke University Hospital's project is now exempt from certificate of need review.

(1) Main Campus

The purpose of this project is to renovate space in Duke North, which is located on the "main campus" of the hospital, to accommodate pediatric acute care beds. The "main campus" of the facility is defined in N.C.G.S. 131E-176(14n) to include both "[t]he site of the main building from which a licensed health service facility provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility, including the buildings and grounds adjacent to that main building" and "[o]ther areas and structures that are not strictly contiguous to the main building but are located within 250 yards of the main building." In this case, Duke University Hospital is a licensed health service facility, and the main hospital building from which Duke University Hospital provides its clinical services and exercises financial and administrative control is the physically contiguous structure that includes Duke South, Duke North, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Duke Medical Pavilion, the Morris Clinic, the Duke Cancer Center, the Wadsworth Building, and the new Hudson Building. The renovations are to existing space within Duke North to accommodate existing acute care beds that are already operated within that facility. Therefore, this project is to renovate and/or expand Duke University Hospital's existing health service facility located on the main campus.

(2) New Institutional Health Services

This project will not change Duke's existing bed capacity, nor include any other new institutional health services. As part of the PCICU relocation, three existing beds currently designated for other purposes will be redesignated as PCICU beds, so that the relocated unit will include 16 beds staffed for PCICU patients; however, the total licensed bed complement will not change.
