Dear Mr. Boethel:

The Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section, Division of Health Service Regulation (Agency) received your letter of July 12, 2016 regarding the above referenced proposal. Based on the CON law in effect on the date of this response to your request, the proposal described in your correspondence is not governed by, and therefore, does not currently require a certificate of need. However, please note that if the CON law is subsequently amended such that the above referenced proposal would require a certificate of need, this determination does not authorize you to proceed to develop the above referenced proposal when the new law becomes effective.

However, you need to contact the Agency's Construction and Adult Care Licensure Sections to determine if they have any requirements for development of the proposed project.

It should be noted that this determination is binding only for the facts represented in your correspondence. Consequently, if changes are made in the project or in the facts provided in your correspondence referenced above, a new determination as to whether a certificate of need is required would need to be made by this office. Changes in a project include, but are not limited to: (1) increases in the capital cost; (2) acquisition of medical equipment not included in the original cost estimate; (3) modifications in the design of the project; (4) change in location; and (5) any increase in the number of square feet to be constructed.



Dear Ms. Frisone:

I am writing on behalf of Regency Retirement Village, which is an adult care home facility, located at 9120 Willow Ridge Road, Charlotte, North Carolina 28210 (the "Facility").

The Facility plans to undertake a minor remodeling project where three adult care home units will be converted from single-occupancy to double-occupancy units by adding one set of interior doors and hardware inside of an existing door frame in the living room area of each unit (the "Renovation Project"). The Renovation Project will create double-occupancy units such that two residents occupying the same unit will each have their own private bedroom, while sharing a kitchen and bathroom space. Each bedroom will already have its own heating and cooling system, window, smoke detector, sprinkler head, and closet space. No additional modifications to electrical, plumbing, and other systems are required pursuant to 10A NCAC 13F.0300.

The Renovation Project will not increase the number of licensed beds operated at the Facility. Rather, the Renovation Project will provide the Facility with the flexibility to accommodate one or two residents in the remodeled units depending on the number of residents occupying the other units in the Facility. The Renovation Project will only affect 100 square feet in three units. The total estimated cost of the Renovation Project is only \$ 3500.00.

Pursuant to the applicable statutes and regulations, the Renovation Project does not constitute a "new institutional health service" under Section 131E-176(16) of the North Carolina General Statutes, which would require review and approval by the Certificate of Need Section because the total capital expenditure of the renovation work does not exceed \$2,000,000. See 131E-176(16)(b). At your convenience, I would appreciate a response confirming in writing that the Renovation Project is exempt from review by the Certificate of Need Section.
