The Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section, Division of Health Service Regulation (Agency), determined that based on your letter of January 9, 2017, the above referenced proposal is exempt from certificate of need review in accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. §131E-184(e). Therefore, you may proceed to offer, develop or establish the above referenced project without a certificate of need.

However, you need to contact the Agency's Construction and Nursing Home Licensure and Certification Sections to determine if they have any requirements for development of the proposed project.

It should be noted that this determination is binding only for the facts represented by you. Consequently, if changes are made in the project or in the facts provided in your correspondence referenced above, a new determination as to whether a certificate of need is required would need to be made by the Agency. Changes in a project include, but are not limited to: (1) increases in the capital cost; (2) acquisition of medical equipment not included in the original cost estimate; (3) modifications in the design of the project; (4) change in location; and (5) any increase in the number of square feet to be constructed.

Dear Ms. Frisone,

As you are aware, United Church Homes and Services d/b/a Abernethy Laurels is currently in the process of constructing a replacement for a portion of its existing nursing home facility on the same site of its continuing care retirement community (CCRC). Abernethy Laurels consists of 174 licensed skilled nursing facility beds and the current project which we call Phase I will accommodate ninety-six (96) of those beds. Construction of Phase I is scheduled for completion by the end of June 2017.

As we near the completion of construction on Phase I, we have been working with our project team to make plans for the replacing the remaining seventy-eight (78) beds. Just as with Phase I, the Phase II project will not result in a change in total bed capacity; however it will provide innovative, homelike residential dining spaces and other common areas which will improve the quality of life of the residents of the nursing home facility.

The purpose of this letter is to provide formal notification to the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Service regulation, CON Section of this exempt replacement and expansion under the CON law's exemption provisions set forth under N.C. Gen. Stat. 131E-184 (e).

Portions of the nursing home facility at Abernethy Laurels were built more than forty-three (43) years ago. The design of the existing facility does not meet modern standards for comfort or energy efficiency, and the current building is made of cinderblock construction. The project team, including the organization's staff and the architectural firm of SFCS, has divided the replacement into two distinct phases. The purpose of this letter is to inform the CON Section pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. 131E-184(e) of the project for the next and final phase of this project, called Phase II, and to seek confirmation that Phase II of the project as I have described it is exempt from CON review.

This second phase includes a two story, steel framed building, with each 39-bed floor organized into two households. Each household serving either nineteen (19) or twenty (20) residents includes kitchen, living, dining and activity spaces in a home-like environment. The Phase II addition is linked to Phase I by a double-loaded corridor to the north with common spaces and administrative offices. To the south, Phase II is connected to the original building by a partially loaded corridor that serves Staff Support functions and new loading/storage/laundry complex to the west. Phase II will be constructed in multiple phases that will be sequenced with demolition. I have enclosed a copy of the schematic design floor plans of the new construction to illustrate the proposed design, realizing that the final design and plans are subject to a full review and approval by the Construction Section of the Division of Health Service Regulation.

For your convenience, I have also attached my letter from January 2015 with details of Phase I and your confirmation sent on March 4, 2015 related to the Phase I project.

Based on the foregoing information, we respectfully request that the Division confirm that the replacement and expansion described herein is exempt from the Certificate of Need review.



United Church Homes and Services d/b/a Abernethy Laurels intends to replace a portion of its existing nursing home facility on the same site of its continuing care retirement community (CCRC). As you know, Abernethy Laurels consists of 174 licensed skilled nursing facility beds. The replacement and expansion will not result in a change in bed capacity; however it will provide innovative, homelike residential dining spaces and other common areas which will improve the quality of life of the residents of the nursing home facility. The project will also allow for the conversion of ninety-six (96) of the resident beds from semi-private room accommodations to private rooms.

The purpose of this letter is to provide formal notification to the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Service regulation, Certificate of Need (CON) Section of this exempt replacement and expansion under the CON law's exemption provisions set forth under N.C. Gen. Stat. 131E-184 (e).

Portions of the nursing home facility at Abernethy Laurels were built more than forty-three (43) years ago. The design of the existing facility does not meet modern standards for comfort or energy efficiency, and the current building is made of cinderblock construction.

The project team, including the organization's staff and the architectural firm of SFCS, has divided the replacement into two distinct phases. The purpose of this letter is to inform the CON Section pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. 131E-184(e) of the expansion and renovation included in this first phase only, and to seek confirmation that the project as I have described it is exempt from CON review.

This first phase includes a two story, steel framed building, with each 48-bed floor organized into three households. Each household serves sixteen (16) residents with living and dining spaces, designed in a residential vernacular to evoke a feeling of "home." The new building will be linked to the existing building via an enclosed connecting corridor. The new building household kitchens are served from the existing main kitchen via the connector to the new building's finishing kitchen. I have enclosed a copy of the schematic design floor plans of the new construction to illustrate the proposed design, realizing that the final design and plans are subject to a full review and approval by the Construction Section of the Division of Health Service Regulation.

The existing healthcare building will remain until we are ready to begin phase two of the project and we will continue to maintain licensure for seventy-eight (78) beds there. To date, only preliminary conceptual plans of this phase have been developed to test the feasibility based on space available and connections which would be needed in order to replace the remaining 78 beds. When the plans and timeline for this project are fully developed, we will submit another request to the Division seeking exemption from CON review with the corresponding details of Phase 2 of the project.

Based on the foregoing information, we respectfully request that the Division confirm that the replacement and expansion described herein is exempt from the Certificate of Need review.
