The Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section, Division of Health Service Regulation (Agency), determined that based on your letter of March 3, 2017, the above referenced proposal is exempt from certificate of need review in accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. § 131E-184(g). Therefore, you may proceed to offer, develop or establish the above referenced project without a certificate of need.

It should be noted that this determination is binding only for the facts represented by you. RE: Request for Exemption from Review to Expand and Renovate Levine Cancer Institute space at The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hospital Authority d/b/a Carolinas Medical Center (CMC)

Dear Ms. Frisone:

I am writing to inform you of The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hospital Authority d/b/a Carolinas Medical Center's plan to expand and renovate Levine Cancer Institute ("LCI") infusion therapy services and related space located on CMC's main campus.

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 131E-184(g), "[t]he Department shall exempt from certificate of need review any capital expenditure that exceeds the two million dollar (\$2,000,000) threshold set forth in G.S. 131E-176(16)b. if any of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to renovate, replace on the same site, or expand the entirety or a portion of an existing health service facility that is located on the main campus.
- (2) The capital expenditure does not result in (i) a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or (ii) the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed in G.S. 131E-176(16)b.
- (3) The licensed health service facility proposing to incur the capital expenditure shall provide written notice to the Department along with support documentation to demonstrate that it meets the exemption criteria of this subsection."

N.C.G.S. 131E-176(14n) states "'Main campus' means all of the following for the purposes of G.S. 131E-184(f) and (g) only:

- a. The site of the main building from which a licensed health service facility provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility, including the buildings and grounds adjacent to that main building.
- b. Other areas and structures that are not strictly contiguous to the main building but are located within 250 yards of the main building."

The Carolinas Medical Center LCI infusion therapy services expansion and renovation project meets each of the applicable conditions set forth above. The estimated total capital cost of the project exceeds \$2,000,000 (see Attachment A for a capital cost worksheet and a certified construction cost estimate). The proposed project involves the expansion and renovation of an existing health service facility located at 1000 Blythe Boulevard, Charlotte, NC 28203, which is the site from which Carolinas Medical Center provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility (see Attachment B). Carolinas Medical Center's President's office is located on the second floor of the main hospital building. Please see a copy of Carolinas Medical Center's license in Attachment C.

The project consists of expansion and renovation of oncology infusion therapy services but does not involve a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or the addition of a health service facility or a new institutional health service. The project will not increase the number of operating rooms or gastrointestinal rooms. The project will not result in the acquisition of major medical equipment or the offering of health services not currently provided.

The project involves minor renovation of space on the existing fourth and fifth floors as well as expansion into new construction that will be located adjacent to the existing LCI space upon completion (see Attachment D for floor plans).

# LCI Expansion and Renovation

The current Levine Cancer Institute building was constructed in 2011 and is located at 1021 Morehead Medical Drive. The current building is connected via covered walkway to the main hospital campus.

On April 26, 2016, The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hospital Authority d/b/a Carolinas Medical Center filed an exemption request (FID #943070) proposing to construct and operate a 260,000 square foot physician office building to be located on the campus of Carolinas Medical Center. The project includes the construction of seven floors as an expansion of and adjacent to the existing Levine Cancer Institute building. On May 4, 2016, this project was deemed Exempt from Review (Record #1935). Please see Attachment E for a copy of the exemption request and approval letter. With the exception of the proposed oncology infusion therapy services, the above referenced exemption was for medical office space.

The project involves minor renovation of space on the fourth and fifth floors of the existing LCI building. The art room that is currently on the fourth floor will be renovated to accommodate additional infusion blood draw space. The lab located on the fifth floor will be renovated to support additional volume. The fourth floor of the physician office building will be up-fitted to accommodate oncology infusion bays and a pharmacy to support these bays. LCI oncology infusion therapy services are currently located on the fourth floor of the existing LCI building. This project proposed to expand the oncology infusion therapy services into the fourth floor of the proposed new construction. Thus, LCI oncology infusion therapy services will encompass the fourth floor of the existing LCI

building and the fourth floor of the expansion (new construction) of the LCI building. The physician office building will be connected to the existing LCI building in order to provide continuity of care to patients receiving infusions.

## Summary

Based on the above facts, the project is exempt from certificate of need review. We are requesting that you confirm in writing that Carolinas Medical Center's LCI infusion therapy services expansion and renovation is exempt from certificate of need review and that we may proceed as planned with this project.


