Dear Mr. Murphy:

The Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section, Division of Health Service Regulation (Agency), determined that based on your letter of January 10, 2020, the above referenced proposal is exempt from certificate of need review in accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. §131E-184(g). Therefore, you may proceed to offer, develop, or establish the above referenced project without a certificate of need.

However, you need to contact the Agency's Construction and Acute and Home Care Licensure and Certification Sections to determine if they have any requirements for development of the proposed project.

It should be noted that this determination is binding only for the facts represented by you. Consequently, if changes are made in the project or in the facts provided in your correspondence referenced above, a new determination as to whether a certificate of need is required would need to be made by the Agency. Changes in a project include, but are not limited to: (1) increases in the capital cost; (2) acquisition of medical equipment not included in the original cost estimate; (3) modifications in the design of the project; (4) change in location; and (5) any increase in the number of square feet to be constructed.

RE: Request for Exemption to CON Review for Critical Care Tower at CaroMont Regional Medical Center / Gaston County

Dear Ms. Frisone:

CaroMont Regional Medical Center (CRMC) intends to construct a four-story critical care tower on the existing medical center campus. CRMC will consolidate and relocate critical care services from their current locations in the medical center to the critical care tower. In addition, CRMC will expand the number of intensive care beds from 25 beds to 52 beds by designating 27 general acute care beds as intensive care beds. CRMC requests a determination that the related capital expenditure is exempt from certificate of need review pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 131E-184(g). The total capital costs are estimated to be approximately \$120.0 million.

#### **Exemption from Review**

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. §131E-184(g), "The Department shall exempt from certificate of need review any capital expenditure that exceeds the two million dollar (\$2,000,000) threshold set forth in G.S. 131E-176(16)b. if all of the following conditions are met:

- 1) The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to renovate, replace on the same site, or expand the entirety or a portion of an existing health service facility that is located on the main campus.
- 2) The capital expenditure does not result in (i) a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or (ii) the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed in G.S. 131E-176(16)b.
- 3) The licensed health service facility proposing to incur the capital expenditure shall provide prior written notice to the Department, along with supporting documentation to demonstrate that it meets the exemption criteria of this subsection."

N.C.G.S. §131E-176(14n) states, "Main campus means all of the following for the purposes of G.S. 131E-184(f) and (g) only:

- a. The site of the main building from which a licensed health service facility provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility, including the buildings and grounds adjacent to that main building.
- b. Other areas and structures that are not strictly contiguous to the main building but are located within 250 yards of the main building."

The CRMC critical care tower project meets each of the applicable conditions set forth above:

- The estimated capital cost of the project exceeds \$2,000,000. Please refer to Attachment A.
- The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to expand the existing health service facility on the main campus located at 2525 Court Drive, Gastonia, North Carolina. The new critical care tower will be located on the main building of the hospital. Please refer to Attachment B.
- The capital expenditure will not result in a change in bed capacity or the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed by G.S. § 131E-176(16)(b).
- · This letter constitutes the required prior written notice.
- CRMC provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control from this location. The CRMC President's office is located on the second floor of the hospital.

Based on the foregoing, we respectfully request that the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section issue written confirmation that this project is exempt from Certificate of Need review under N.C.G.S § 131E-184(g).
