RE: Request for No CON Review Determination for Pharmacy Renovation at Novant Health New Hanover Regional Medical Center - ED North / New Hanover County

Dear Ms. Frisone:

Novant Health New Hanover Regional Medical Center ("NH NHRMC") intends to renovate and upgrade the pharmacy located in the ED North facility by constructing a new pharmacy clean room to comply with current USP 800 Standards. NH NHRMC requests a determination that such related capital expenditure does not require a certificate of need review pursuant to G.S. 131E-178(c) and the definition of a new institutional health service as defined in G.S. 131E-176(16)b. The total estimated capital costs are \$130,800.

No CON Review Determination

Pursuant to G.S. 131E-178(c) the following activity requires obtaining a certificate of need:

- (c) No person shall incur an obligation for a capital expenditure which is a new institutional health service without first obtaining a certificate of need from the Department. An obligation for a capital expenditure is incurred when:
 - (1) An enforceable contract, excepting contracts which are expressly contingent upon issuance of a certificate of need, is entered into by a person for the construction, acquisition, lease or financing of a capital asset;
 - (2) A person takes formal action to commit funds for a construction project undertaken as his own contractor; or
 - (3) In the case of donated property, the date on which the gift is completed.

Pursuant to G.S. 131E-176(16)b. a new institutional health service is defined as

b. Except as otherwise provided in G.S. 131E-184(e), the obligation by any person of a capital expenditure exceeding two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to develop or expand a health service or a health service facility, or which relates to the provision of a health service. The cost of any studies, surveys, designs, plans, working drawings, specifications, and other activities, including staff effort and consulting and other services, essential to the acquisition, improvement, expansion, or replacement of any plant or equipment with respect to which an expenditure is made shall be included in determining if the expenditure exceeds two million dollars (\$2,000,000).



The NH NHRMC ED North Pharmacy Renovation project does not meet the condition set forth in G.S. 131E-176 (16)b.:

The estimated capital cost of the project is \$130,800.

Based on the foregoing, we respectfully request that the Healthcare Planning and CON Section issue written confirmation that this project does not require a certificate of need review.

RE: Request for Exemption to CON Review for Pharmacy Renovation at Novant Health New Hanover Regional Medical Center / New Hanover County

Dear Ms. Frisone:

Novant Health New Hanover Regional Medical Center ("NH NHRMC") intends to renovate and upgrade the two pharmacies located in the hospital by constructing new pharmacy clean rooms to comply with current USP 800 Standards. NH NHRMC requests a determination that such related capital expenditure is exempt from certificate of need review pursuant to G.S. 131E-184(g). The total estimated capital costs are \$3,669,200.

Exemption from Review

Pursuant to G.S. 131E-184(g), "[t]he Department shall exempt from certificate of need review any capital expenditure that exceeds the two million dollar (\$2,000,000) threshold set forth in G.S. 131E 176(16)b. if all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to renovate, replace on the same site, or expand the entirety or a portion of an existing health service facility that is located on the main campus.
- (2) The capital expenditure does not result in (i) a change in bed capacity as defined in G.S. 131E-176(5) or (ii) the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed in G.S. 131E-176(16)b.
- (3) The licensed health service facility proposing to incur the capital expenditure shall provide prior written notice to the Department, along with supporting documentation to demonstrate that it meets the exemption criteria of this subsection."

G.S. 131E-176(14n) states, "'Main campus means all of the following for the purposes of G.S. 131E-184(f) and (g) only:

- a. The site of the main building from which a licensed health service facility provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control over the entire facility, including the buildings and grounds adjacent to that main building.
- b. Other areas and structures that are not strictly contiguous to the main building but are located within 250 yards of the main building."



The NH NHRMC Pharmacy Renovation project meets each of the applicable conditions set forth above:

- The estimated capital cost of the project exceeds \$2,000,000.
- The sole purpose of the capital expenditure is to renovate an existing ancillary service at NH NHRMC, on the main campus located at 2131 S. 17th Street, Wilmington, North Carolina, 28401. As previously stated, the pharmacy renovations will occur in the main building of the hospital.
- The capital expenditure will not result in a change in bed capacity or the addition of a health service facility or any other new institutional health service other than that allowed by G.S. 131E-176(16)(b).
- This letter constitutes the required prior written notice.
- NH NHRMC provides clinical patient services and exercises financial and administrative control from this location.

Based on the foregoing, we respectfully request that the Healthcare Planning and CON Section issue written confirmation that this project is exempt from Certificate of Need under G.S. 131E-184(g).
