The Nature of Dignity

- Everyone has the right to be treated in a dignified manner
- The act of demonstrating dignity has the potential to change the world
- After people learn about dignity, a remarkable thing happens with employee behavior

The Nature of Dignity (2)

Nurse aides have the potential to change where they work by treating individuals with dignity.

- Provide privacy
- Be respectful and courteous
- Encourage independence
- Allow for cultural preferences



Dignity

“Quality or state of being worthy of esteem or self-respect”

OBRA 1987 defines how residents **MUST** be treated while living in a long-term care facility



Dignity - Resident's Rights

Federal regulations state a resident has a right to be treated with dignity and respect



Why is Dignity Important?

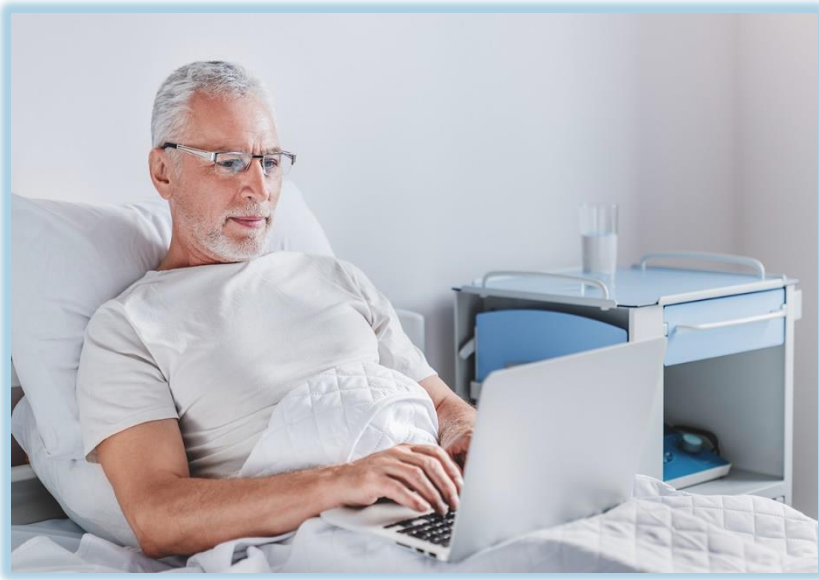
- Promotes sense of self-importance
- Promotes quality of life
- Promotes feelings of positive self-worth
- Guides in giving care



Dignity - Nurse Aide's Role

- Focus on each resident as an individual
- Maintain and enhance their sense of self-esteem and self-worth
- Be familiar with preferences when meeting resident needs
- Respect the resident's choices and refrain from judging
- Assist with attending activities of choice
- Respect room and possessions

How can a nurse aide demonstrate respectful behaviors toward a resident's private space and property?

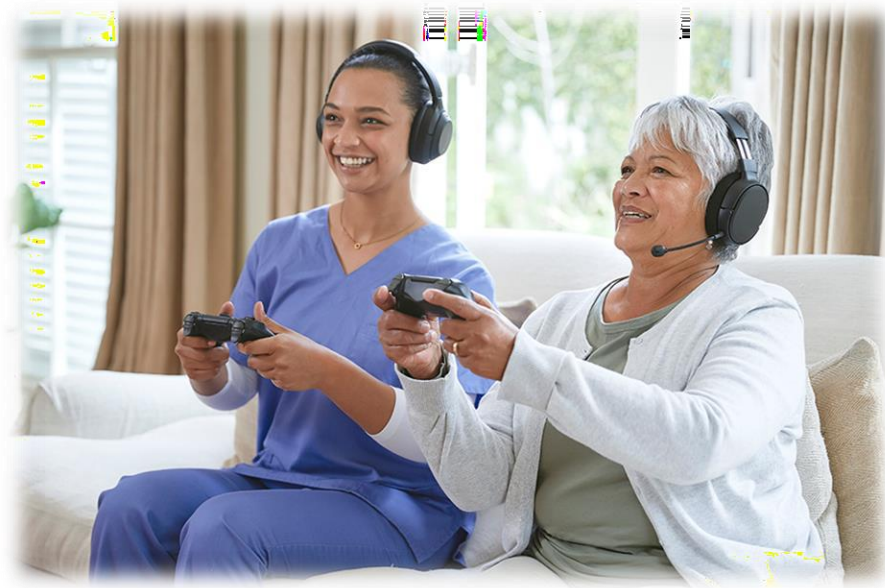
Dignity - Points to Remember

A resident's dignity is valued when the nurse aide gives appropriate, compassionate, and effective care
