Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs (2)

- The nurse aide is a vital link in assisting the resident to achieve individual levels of need
- The order of importance begins at the lowest level on the hierarchy
- Lower-level needs must be met before higher-level needs are met



The Interdisciplinary Care Plan

The health care team has the responsibility to provide a plan of care:

- Based on the individual needs of the resident
- Used for coordination and continuity of care
- Used to support directives given from the doctor and other members of the healthcare team

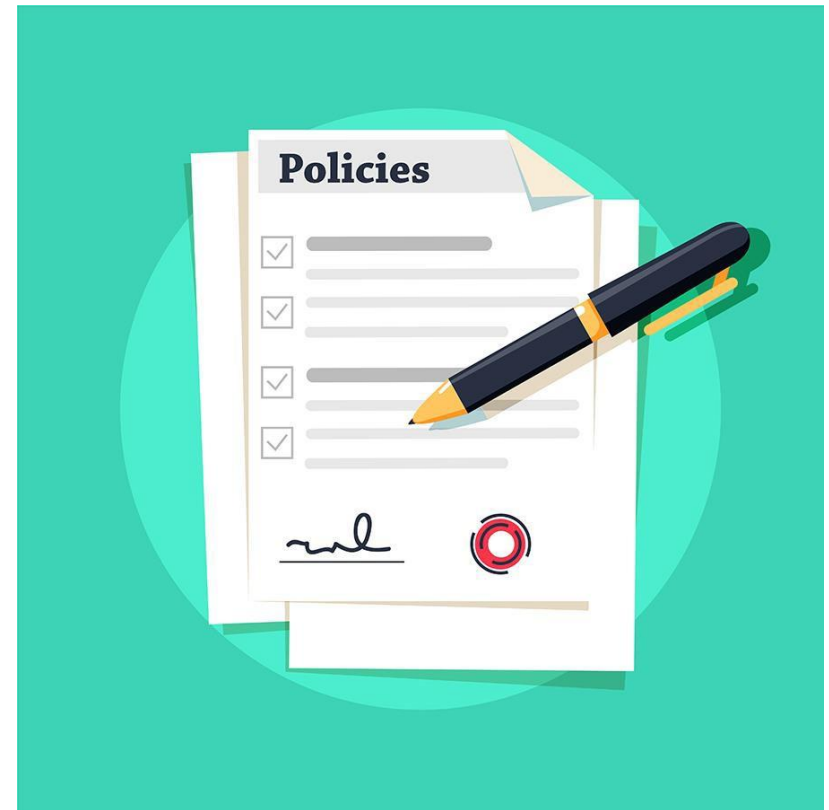
Importance of the Interdisciplinary Care Plan

The interdisciplinary care plan:

- is organized, individualized, and has purpose
- begins on admission
- guides the healthcare team members on the delivery of care
- is instrumental for resident safety
- determines consistent care for the resident

Delegation of Tasks



A registered nurse assesses knowledge and skills of the delegate and matches tasks to skills



Delegation to the nurse aide improves efficiency and shows trust

The 5 Rights of Delegation

- Right Person
- Right Task
- Right Circumstance
- Right Directions and Communication
- Right Supervision and Evaluation



Responsibilities of the Nurse Aide in Delegation

- Accept tasks based on own competence level
- Maintain competence for delegated responsibility
- Maintain accountability for delegated tasks
