

Emergency Plan in Action

- If you are with a patient when a natural or manmade disaster occurs, it is important to remain calm
- Put your agency's emergency plan into action
- Do not leave your patient until it is safe to do so

FIRE SAFETY



FIRE SAFETY PLAN

Decreased mobility, health, sight, and hearing may limit a person's ability to take the quick action necessary to escape during a fire emergency.



PATIENT FIRE HAZARDS

It is ok to remind the patient of possible hazards that the home care aide may see but ALWAYS report concerns to your supervisor!
