# Acute Care Services Committee

## Recommendations to the North Carolina State Health Coordinating Council

October 8, 2008

The Acute Care Services (ACS) Committee met on September 16, 2008 to consider Petitions and Comments received in response to Chapters 5 through 8 of the Proposed 2009 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP). Copies of Agency Reports, Petitions and Comments are included in the meeting packet.

Following is an overview of the September 16 ACS Committee meeting and the Committee's recommendations for the Acute Care Services chapters of the 2009 SMFP. The report is organized by Chapter of the SMFP.

Attached to this report are Tables 5A and 5B and 6B and 6C, updated since the Proposed Plan was published. Also attached is the Trauma/Burn Case Data Table, updated since the September 16, 2008 ACS Committee meeting

## **5** Acute Care Beds - pages 35-52 of the Proposed 2009 Plan

### *Acute Care Days Data:*

Committee members reviewed a table listing the hospitals with discrepancies between the Thomson acute care data and the License Renewal Application acute care data of five percent or greater. The table indicated which data, Thomson or Licensure, would be corrected, to reconcile the discrepancy.

Columbus County Hospital reported that the hospital will not be reconciling their data this year but is taking steps to ensure that the data from the two sources will reconcile in the future.

### **Committee Recommendation - Acute Care Days Data:**

Indicate with a note in the 2009 SMFP that Columbus County Hospital's data were not reconciled and that Acute Care Bed Need would not have been affected if the data had been changed.

### *Petitions:*

Four Acute Care Bed petitions were received during the public comment period. The petitions and recommendations are summarized below:

#### 1. Carolinas HealthCare System:

Requests that the State Health Coordinating Council (SHCC) form an expert workgroup to review and update the acute care bed need methodology for the 2010 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP).

2. **Novant Health:**

Requests an adjusted bed need determination for Mecklenburg and Forsyth Counties based upon the HSA-specific patient day growth rate rather than on the North Carolina statewide average acute inpatient days growth rate of 0.01%.

3. **Carolinas Medical Center-Union:**

Requests an adjusted need determination in the 2009 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP) for 25 additional acute care beds in Union County.

The above three petitions were reviewed together because the common theme found in each of the petitions is the current use of a statewide average growth rate to project acute care bed need, which in recent years has been very low.

**Committee Recommendations – Carolinas HealthCare System , Novant Health, Carolinas Medical Center-Union Petitions:**

1. Create a work group to review the Acute Care Bed Need methodology;
2. Deny the Novant Health and CMC-Union petitions.

**WakeMed:**

Requests a special need determination for 18 additional acute care beds in Wake County to be designated for neonatal patients only in the 2009 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP).

The petitioner cited as rationale for the petition the high utilization of the Wake County licensed neonatal beds and the competitive disadvantage that exists for licensed neonatal beds compared to general acute care beds.

**Committee Recommendation – WakeMed Petition:**

Approve the adjusted need determination petition for 18 additional acute care beds, to be designated as licensed neonatal beds, for Wake County in the 2009 SMFP.

**Additional Committee Recommendation:**

Approve Chapter 5, Acute Care Beds, including updates and corrections to Chapter 5 tables and narrative, as needed.

*(Updated Table 5A, which includes the corrected Thomson data and the Wake County adjusted need determination, is attached. Updated Table 5B is also attached.)*

## **6 Operating Rooms** - pages 53-111 of the Proposed 2009 Plan

**Petition:**

One Operating Room adjusted need determination petition was received during the public comment period. The petition and recommendation are summarized below:

**Randolph Hospital, et al.:**

Request a special needs determination for three Operating Rooms in Randolph County.

Randolph Hospital inadvertently understated surgical volumes on their 2008 Hospital License Renewal Application and when the need for additional operating rooms in Randolph County is recalculated using the corrected number of surgical cases, there is need for one additional operating room.

**Committee Recommendation – Randolph Hospital Petition:**

Accept Randolph Hospital’s corrected surgical case data resulting in one additional operating room in Randolph County.

*Trauma/Burn Center Operating Room Exclusion:*

The Committee discussed the Agency Report on the Trauma/Burn Center Operating Room Exclusion and reviewed the trauma/burn case data submitted by the Designated Trauma/Burn Centers. The Committee agreed that the Designated Trauma/Burn centers are not currently using the same definition for the trauma and burn cases that are excluded from the need determination methodology.

The Agency made recommendations for the 2009 SMFP as well as recommendations for future consideration. Agency recommendations are shown below:

Recommendations for the 2009 SMFP:	Additional Recommendations for Consideration in the Future:
<p>When determining need for additional operating rooms, exclude one OR at each Level I and Level II designated trauma center and one additional OR at each designated burn intensive care unit and also exclude the associated cases performed in these operating rooms.</p>	<p>Develop a standard definition for the excluded trauma and burn cases.</p>
<p>Continue to request trauma/burn case data from the trauma/burn centers only when a need is determined in an operating room service area with a designated trauma/burn center.</p>	<p>Explore sources of trauma/burn case data and if accurate readily accessible data is available, use that data to exclude trauma/burn cases at each designated Level I and Level II trauma center and at each designated burn intensive care unit. If accurate readily accessible data is not available, continue to request trauma/burn case data from the trauma/burn centers only when a need is determined in an operating room service area with a designated trauma/burn center.</p>

**Committee Recommendations – Trauma/Burn Center OR Exclusion:**

Approve the Agency recommendations and direct staff to:

- Work with hospital planners to develop a draft definition of the trauma and burn cases to be excluded when determining need for additional operating rooms;
- Collect trauma/burn case data using the draft definition;
- Provide to the ACS Committee for their review and approval the draft definition and the trauma/burn case data using the draft definition.

*Tiered Operating Room Data*

The Committee discussed the Agency Report on Tiered Operating Room Data noting that using

the tiered data assumptions results in a greater surplus of operating rooms compared to using the standard methodology assumptions.

**Committee Recommendation – Tiered OR Data:**

For the 2009 Plan, do not adopt the tiered methodology for determining need for additional operating rooms but continue to evaluate the tiered approach.

*Single Specialty Ambulatory Surgery Work Group*

Dr. Greene and Dr. Cutchin updated the Committee on the Work Group's progress and informed the Committee that the Work Group will have recommendations for the 2010 SMFP. No action from the Committee was needed.

*Affordable HealthCare and Carolina Ophthalmology Petitions:*

At the April 2 and May 8 Committee meetings, the Committee reviewed and discussed the petitions but did not vote to approve or deny them. At the September 16 Committee meeting, the Committee noted that the Single Specialty Ambulatory Surgery Work Group has been tasked with working on issues relevant to the petitioners.

**Committee Recommendation - Affordable HealthCare and Carolina Ophthalmology Petitions:**

Deny both petitions.

**Additional Committee Recommendation:**

Approve Chapter 6, Operating Rooms, including updates and corrections to Chapter 6 tables and narrative, as needed.

*(Updated Tables 6B and 6C, including the corrected surgical case data from Randolph Hospital resulting in need for one additional OR in Randolph County, are attached.)*

**7 Other Acute Care Services - pages 113-127 of the Proposed 2009 Plan**

*Comment Related to Heart-Lung Bypass Machines and Corrected Table 7A:*

Committee reviewed the comment from UNC Healthcare related to data in Table 7B, Heart-Lung Bypass machines and also reviewed corrected Table 7A.

**Committee Recommendation – Table 7A:**

Approve corrected Table 7A

**Additional Committee Recommendation:**

Approve Chapter 7, Other Acute Care Services, including updates and corrections to Chapter 7 tables and narrative, as needed.

## **8 Inpatient Rehabilitation Services** – pages 129-132 of the Proposed 2009 Plan

### *Petitions:*

Two Inpatient Rehabilitation Services adjusted need determination petitions were received during the public comment period. The petitions and recommendations are summarized below:

#### **Rex Hospital:**

Requests that the State Health Coordinating Council (SHCC) adjust the need determination in Health Service Area IV (HSA IV) to show a projected need for 16 Inpatient rehabilitation beds in the 2009 SMFP.

The petitioner cited as rationale for the petition the ratio of population to inpatient rehabilitation beds and the fact that inpatient rehabilitation capacity is overstated when all licensed and CON approved rehabilitation beds are used when determining need for additional beds.

#### **Committee Recommendation – Rex Hospital Petition:**

Deny the Rex Hospital petition.

#### **Novant Health and Rowan Regional Medical Center (RRMC):**

Request that the SHCC adjust the need determination in the Draft 2009 State Medical Facilities Plan to include ten inpatient rehabilitation beds at the Elizabeth C. Stanback Rehabilitation Unit at RRMC in Rowan County.

The petitioner cited as rationale for the petition adverse effects on inpatient rehabilitation patients in Rowan and surrounding counties if the petition is not approved and the need for an inpatient rehabilitation facility located in Rowan County.

#### **Committee Recommendation – Novant Health and Rowan Regional Medical Center**

Deny the Novant Health and Rowan Regional Medical Center petition.

#### **Additional Committee Recommendation:**

Approve Chapter 8, Inpatient Rehabilitation Services, including updates and corrections to Chapter 8 tables and narrative, as needed.
