State Health Coordinating Council/Mobile MRI Need Determination

The Proposed 2010 State Medical Facilities Plan requests comment on whether the statement, "There is no need for any additional mobile MRI scanners anywhere in the state" should be adopted into the Plan. NCHA supports inclusion of that statement on need for mobile MRI for the 2010 State Medical Facilities Planning year.

Nearly every county in NC has access to at least one MRI site, and nearly every hospital in the state has a fixed MRI unit. Even most of the state's smaller counties have numerous MRI sites. Data from recent SMFPs indicate that the total number of scans across NC and the number of scans per "fixed equivalent magnet" have dropped during the past year. As patient access to MRI services across the state is available, the drop in the number of scans per magnet should be considered, and NCHA supports the proposed statement of "no need for any additional mobile MRI scanners anywhere in the state."
