

As President and Chief Executive Officer of Medwest Health System, we request that a new methodology be developed to determine the need for additional mobile PET scanners in the Western Region of North Carolina.

The Medical Facilities Planning Section determined no need for an additional mobile scanner in Western North Carolina for 2011. Haywood and Jackson Counties are a rural area, and patients in both are underserved and often lack access to PET services. There is currently only one mobile PET scanner for 18 hospitals in Western North Carolina and it is operating at capacity. The current PET scanner in the Medwest Health System, located at Medwest Harris, receives mobile PET services only one day every other week. The proposed mobile PET methodology will ensure greater safety and quality access.

Medwest Health System believes that the proposed mobile PET methodology warrants support in order to provide fair, reliable processes for determining statewide need for additional mobile PET scanners.
