

As EMS Medical Director of Carteret General Hospital's Emergency Department, I regularly encounter and manage care for people with an Acute MI. Carteret General has an excellent Emergency Department medical and nursing staff. We organize quickly to transfer patients to the nearest and most appropriate care. We are part of the regional cardiac emergency response network and offer thrombolytic therapy at the hospital. Our EMS program was one of the first in the state to allow our EMS providers to perform their skills in the hospital setting.

Too often, we refer directly to the nearest cardiac catheterization laboratory, which is 34 minutes from our nearest community, Newport, and 1.5 hours from our most distant community, Sea Level. With the number of cardiac catheterizations performed on Carteret County residents exceeding 1500 annually over the past three years, it is time to have cardiac catheterization at Carteret General Hospital. We are central to the county, only 15 minutes from Newport and 43 minutes from Sea Level.

I ask that DHSR Planning Staff recommend and that the full State Health Coordinating Council approve the request from Carteret General Hospital for an adjusted need determination for a shared fixed cardiac catheterization laboratory in Carteret County for the 2013 State Medical Facilities Plan.

Carteret County's unique demographic requires that every week we must arrange transfers for patients who truly need cardiac catheterization to conform to EMTALA regulations and complete their diagnosis and stabilization. We arrange excellent transport and work with excellent tertiary care facilities, but the arrangement places extreme hardships on our patients and their families. The stress is unnecessary and involves risk. Carteret County has a large enough need to support a full cardiac catheterization laboratory.

The quality track record of Carteret General is well documented in its petition. Cardiac catheterization will get this same level of excellent attention.

Please agree to the petitions from both Carteret General and Johnston Memorial. Please include a special need for a shared fixed cardiac catheterization unit in Carteret County. Also, please address the temporary rule to permit cardiac catheterization laboratories that meet the AHA guidelines to offer both therapeutic and diagnostic catheterizations.
