- Addition of the proposed non-hospital affiliated ambulatory surgical center will inevitably draw surgical cases from the hospital, which, over time, will lead to decreased revenue for OMH.
- The current draft of the 2018 SMFP clearly shows a surplus of 3.3 operating rooms in Onslow County. This surplus provides alternative solutions using existing resources.

If the State approves what amounts to building excess capacity in Onslow County, it will be even harder for our essential rural hospital to compete and recruit physicians and other staff. This petition does not protect the interests of rural communities. It would come at long-term negative cost to a rural hospital and community.
