## THE NORTH CAROLINA MEDICAL CARE COMMISSION

## **ROLE OF THE COMMISSION**

The North Carolina Medical Care Commission was created primarily as a result of the findings of the North Carolina Hospital and Medical Care Commission, a special commission appointed in 1944 to study the critical shortages in general hospital facilities and trained medical personnel in the State of North Carolina and to make recommendations for improvements in these areas. Among the recommendations made was that the legislature provide for a permanent State agency that would be responsible for the maintenance of high standards in North Carolina's hospitals, and the administration of a medical student loan fund, and a statewide hospital and medical care program.

The Commission was established in 1945 and empowered by its enabling legislation to, among other things:

- 1. make a survey of the hospital resources of the State and formulate a statewide program for construction and maintenance of local hospitals, health centers and related facilities, and receive and administer federal and State Funds appropriated for such purposes;
- 2. make loans to medical students; and
- 3. survey all factors concerning the location of the expanded university medical school. (The same act authorized the expansion of the University of North Carolina Medical School from a two-year to a four-year program).

In 1946, Congress passed the Hospital Survey and Construction Act (Hill-Burton) to provide funds for the construction and renovation of health care facilities, and the Commission was designated as the State agency empowered to administer the program within North Carolina. Under this program, which is also known as the Hill-Burton program, health care facility construction in North Carolina totaled more than \$500 million dollars, of which 40 percent was provided by federal sources, 5 percent by the State, and 55 percent by local sponsors. Of the more than 500 Hill-Burton projects approved by the Commission between 1946 and 1976, 241 were general hospital projects, including 80 completely new facilities.

Pursuant to the Executive Organization Act of 1973, the 17-member Commission was incorporated into the Department of Health and Human Services. Three members of the Commission are nominated by the North Carolina Medical Society, one by the North Carolina Pharmaceutical Association, one by the North Carolina State Nurses' Association, one by the North Carolina Hospital Association, and one by the Duke Endowment. Each nomination is subject to the Governor's approval. In addition, ten members, one of whom must be a dentist, are appointed by the Governor. Each member is appointed to a four-year term and memberships are staggered. The Commission is attached organizationally to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Service Regulation (formerly Division of Facility Services), and is staffed by that Agency. Since its inception the Commission has been assigned new responsibilities, while some of the original activities are either no longer needed or are carried out elsewhere. Today the Commission is responsible for the development of rules for:

1. the licensure and operations of hospitals, hospices, free-standing outpatient surgical facilities, nursing homes, home health agencies, home care agencies, nursing pools, and adult care facilities;

- 2. the regulation of ambulances and emergency medical services personnel;
- 3. the financing of construction and modernization projects for qualifying health care facilities.

In 1975, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted the Health Care Facilities Finance Act. The Act provides that the North Carolina Medical Care Commission may conduct financing activities to "acquire, construct, equip, or provide health care facilities for any public or nonprofit agency." The Act defines health care facilities as "any building, addition, or improvement including machinery, equipment, or furnishings that are suitable for health care." This definition includes but is not necessarily limited to: general acute care or specialty hospitals, nursing homes, continuing care facilities for the elderly, health care clinics, and outpatient facilities; laboratories and research facilities; laundries and other ancillary service facilities; training facilities for health care personnel, administration buildings, parking lots, garages, and other buildings normally under the jurisdiction of health care facilities.

The law provides that to qualify for assistance under the Act a project must meet several criteria:

- 1. the applicant must be a non-profit agency or public agency as defined in General Statute 131A-3;
- 2. the Commission must be satisfied that there is a need for the project in the area where it is to be located;
- 3. the project applicant must be financially responsible and capable of fulfilling its obligation for making debt service payments;
- 4. all public facilities such as utilities and other public services necessary for the health care facility must be made available; and
- 5. all costs associated with the project must be borne by the applicant and not the State.

While several states have health care finance authorities, which issue tax-exempt bonds, the organization and authority of the North Carolina Medical Care Commission make it unique. First, it is not a quasiindependent authority. It is an operational agency of the executive branch of North Carolina State Government, located in the Department of Health and Human Services. Second, it has an affiliation that covers all the major steps involved in a construction project, either directly or through the Division of Health Service Regulation which staffs the Commission. The Division of Health Service Regulation develops the State Medical Facilities Plan, issues Certificates of Need, assists in project development, approves construction plans, monitors the construction process, and finally licenses the facility.

#### OUTSTANDING DEBT

As of June 30, 2017, the Commission has closed 493 revenue bonds, notes and leases. The total authorized principal amount of all such financings was \$23,166,230,579 and the total outstanding principal amount of all such financings as of June 30, 2017, was \$6,610,632,081 excluding financings that have been refunded. Each issue is payable solely from revenues derived from each corporate entity financed, is separately secured, and is separate and independent from all other series of bonds as to source of payment and security.

## 1. Deerfield Episcopal Retirement Community, Incorporated - \$40,060,000

On August 10, 2016, the Commission issued its \$40,060,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Deerfield Episcopal Retirement Community), Series 2016 dated as of the date of delivery (August 10, 2016). The proceeds of the Series 2016 Bonds are being used, together with other available funds to (1) refund \$45,470,000 of the outstanding North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Bonds (Deerfield Episcopal Retirement Community) Series 2008A, which are all of the 2008A Bonds maturing on and after November 1, 2019 and (2) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2016 Bonds.

The Series 2016 Bonds are rated A- by Fitch Ratings, Inc. The \$4,490,000 Serial Bonds maturing on November 1, in the years 2016-2027 and carry interest rates ranging from .750% to 2.375% and yields ranging from .75% to 2.45%. The \$8,615,000 5.00% Term Bonds due November 1, 2031 yield 2.47%. The \$4,000,000 3.00% Term Bonds due November 1, 2031 yield 3.00%. The \$20,455,000 5.00% Term Bonds due November 1, 2037 yield 2.70%.

The \$2,500,000 3.25% Term Bonds due November 1, 2037 yield 3.25%.

## 2. Duke University Health System - \$125,100,000

On August 11, 2016, the Commission issued its \$125,100,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities Revenue Refunding Bonds (Duke University Health System) Series 2016D dated as of the Date of Delivery (August 11, 2016). The proceeds of the Series 2016D Bonds are being used to refund all of the outstanding North Carolina Medical Care Commission \$120,000,000 Health Care Facilities Revenue Bonds (Duke University Health System) Series 2010A and to pay certain expenses of issuing the 2016D Bonds.

The Series 2016 D Bonds are rated Aa2 by Moody's, AA by Standard and Poor's Ratings Services and AA by Fitch. The \$62,870,000 Serial Bonds mature on June 1 in the years 2029 through 2036 and carry interest rates ranging from 4.00% to 5.00% with yields ranging from 2.02% to 2.66%. The \$50,000,000 4.00% Term Bonds due June 1, 2042 yield 2.77%. The \$12,230,000 3.00% Term Bonds due June 1, 2042 yield 3.00%.

JP Morgan Chase served as senior manager for the Issue with PNC Capital Markets, LLC, Bank of America Merrill Lynch and Jefferies as co-managers. Robinson Bradshaw & Hinson, P.A. served as bond counsel.

Parker Poe Adams & Bernstein, LLP served as counsel to the Underwriters. The Bank of New York Melon Trust Company, N.A. serves as Bond Trustee for the Issue.

## 3. Moravian Home, Inc. dba Salemtowne - \$23,470,000

On September 7, 2016, the Commission issued its \$23,470,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Salemtowne) Series 2016A, dated as of the date of delivery, September 7, 2016. The proceeds of the 2016 Bonds are being used, together with other available funds, (1) to refund all of the Commission's Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Salemtowne) Series 2006 maturing after October 1, 2016 and (2) pay certain expenses incurred.

The Series 2016 Bonds are not rated. The \$2,890,000 Serial Bonds maturing October 1 in the years 2017-2019 carry interest rates ranging from 1.500% to 2.125% and yields ranging from 1.500% to 2.125%. The 5.00% \$2,380,000 Term Bonds maturing October 1, 2020 yield 2.25%. The 5.00% \$8,685,000 Term Bonds maturing October 1, 2026 yields 3.125%. The 3.250% \$1,200,000 Term Bonds maturing October 1, 2026 yield 3.375%. The 5.00% \$6,915,000 Term Bonds maturing October 1, 2030 yields 3.500%. The 3.625% \$1,400,000 Term Bonds maturing October 1, 2020 yields 3.75%.

Ziegler served as senior manager for the Issue with Davenport and Company as co-manager Robinson Bradshaw & Hinson, P.A. served as bond counsel and Parker Poe Adams & Bernstein, LLP served as counsel to the underwriters. ## 4. <u>Mission Health - \$53,985,000</u>

On September 14, 2016, the Commission issued its \$53,925,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health System Revenue Refunding Bonds (Mission Health Combined Group) Series 2016, dated as of the Date of Issuance (September 14, 2016).

The proceeds of the Series 2016 Bonds are being used together, with other available funds, to (a) refund a portion of the Commission's outstanding Health System Revenue Bonds (Mission Health Combined Group), Series 2007 and a portion of the Commission's outstanding Health System Revenue Bonds (Mission Health Combined Group), Series 2010 and (b) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the authorization, issuance and sale of the Series 2016 Bonds.

The Series 2016 Bond Issues are rated AA- by Fitch, Aa3 by Moody's and AA- by Standard & Poor's Rating Services.

The \$53,985,000 Series 2016 Bonds mature on October 1, in the years 2020 through 2035 and bear interest rates ranging from 2.00% to 5.00% with yields ranging from .89% to 3.00%.

Womble Carlyle Sandridge and Rice, LLP served as bond counsel for both the Series 2016 Bonds. Wells Fargo Securities served as senior manager for the two issues with Bank of America Merrill Lynch as co-

managers. McGuire Woods, LLP served as counsel to the Underwriters. The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A. serves as Bond Trustee for both Issues.

## 5. Halifax Regional Medical Center - \$8,845,000

On September 27, 2016, the Commission issued its \$8,845,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Hospital Revenue Refunding Bonds (Halifax Regional Medical Center) Series 2016. The proceeds of the Series 2016 Bonds are being used to refund the \$33,670,000 Hospital Revenue Bonds (Halifax Regional Medical Center) Series 1998, outstanding in the amount of \$10,405,000. The reserve fund for the Series 1998 Bonds was utilized to reduce the amount of the Series 2016 Bonds required to be issued to \$8,845,000. The Series 2016 Bonds are being purchased by Branch Banking and Trust Company and held as Bank Bought Bonds. The Series 2016 Bonds carry an interest rate of 2.31% and mature August 1, 2024.

Halifax Regional Medical Center is located in Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina and is rated Ba3 Positive by Moody's and BB+ Positive by Fitch, Inc. The Series 2016 Bonds are not being rated. After the issuance of the Series 2016 Bonds, Halifax will no longer have any rated debt.

McGuire Woods, LLP served as bond counsel. Moore and Van Allen served as counsel to BB&T. US Bank serves as Bond Trustee.

## 6. <u>Presbyterian Homes - \$48,690,837 and \$29,220,000</u>

On September 28, 2016, the Commission issued (1) its \$48,690,837 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (The Presbyterian Homes Obligated Group) Series 2016B, and (2) its \$29,220,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (The Presbyterian Homes Obligated Group) Series 2016C. The proceeds of the 2016B Bonds and the 2016C Bonds are being used, together with other available funds, to (1) refund the North Carolina Medical Care Commission Series 2006 Bonds (\$16,260,000).

The Series 2016B Bonds are being purchased by BB&T Community Holding Company and held as Bank Bought Bonds. The Series 2016B Bonds bear interest at the rate of 68% of one month LIBOR plus 0.715% and are being held by the Bank until maturity (2027). The publicly offered Series 2016C Bonds are being issued as Term Bonds. The \$10,000,000 2031 Term Bond has a 4.00% coupon and matures October 1, 2031 has a yield of 2.77%. The \$15,770,000 2031 Term Bond has 5.00% coupon and matures October 1, 2031 and a yield of 2.47%. The \$1,000,000 2036 Term Bond has coupon of 3.000% and matures October 1, 2036 and a yield of 3.125%. The \$2,450,000 2036 Term Bond has a coupon of 5.00% and matures October 1, 2036 and a yield of 2.710%. The Series 2016C Bonds are rated A- by Fitch Ratings, Inc.

Ziegler served as senior manager for the Series 2016C Bonds and Davenport & Company, LLC served as co-manager for the Series 2016C Bonds. Parker Poe Adams & Bernstein, LLP served as bond counsel for the two Issues. Robinson Bradshaw & Hinson, P.A. served as counsel to the underwriters for the 2016C Bond Issue. US Bank serves as Bond Trustee.

## 7. <u>Novant Health - \$47,455,000</u>

On September 30, 2016, the Commission reissued for federal tax purposes its \$70,000,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Variable Rate Demand Health Care Facilities Revenue Refunding Bonds (Novant Health Obligated Group) Series 2008A outstanding in the amount of \$47,455,000. In connection with the reissuance the bank holder (Wells Fargo) and Novant Health agreed to modify the existing tender rate period to provide that the holder of the Bonds will hold the Bonds for five years instead of three years and change the interest rate from 68% of one-month LIBOR plus .50% to 68% of one-month LIBOR plus .60%.

Robinson Bradshaw & Hinson, P.A. served as bond counsel for the transaction. Regions Bank serves as Bond Trustee.

## 8. <u>Southminster, Inc. - \$58,765,000</u>

On November 10, 2016, the Commission issued its \$58,760,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Southminster) Series 2016, dated as of the date of issuance (November 10, 2016). The proceeds of the issue are being used, together with other available funds to, (1) advance refund the outstanding North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Bonds (Southminster Project) Series 2007A in the amount of \$61,515,000 and (2) pay certain fees and expenses incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2016 Bonds.

The Series 2016 Bonds are not rated. The \$18,895,000 Serial Bonds mature on October 1 in the years 2017-2037 and carry stated interest rates ranging from 1.50% to 5.00% and yields ranging from 1.500% to 3.120%. The \$15,540,000 2031 Term Bonds with an interest rate of 5.00% yield 3.500%. The 2,500,000 2037 Term Bonds with an interest rate of 4.000% yield 4,125%. The \$21,830,000 2037 Term Bond with an interest rate of 5.000% yield 3.75%.

Ziegler served as senior manager for the Issue with Davenport & Company, LLC as co-manager. Womble Carlyle Sandridge & Rice, LLP served as bond counsel. Parker Poe Adams & Bernstein, LLP served as counsel to the underwriters. The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A. served as Bond Trustee.

## 9. Blue Ridge Healthcare System, Inc. - \$35,000,000

On December 14, 2016, the Commission issued its \$35,000,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities Refunding Revenue Bonds (Blue Ridge Healthcare System, Inc.), Series 2016 dated as of the date of delivery (December 14, 2016). The proceeds of the Series 2016 Bonds are being used to refund the \$35,000,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities Revenue Bonds (Blue Ridge Healthcare System, Inc.) Series 2005A. The Series 2016 Bonds are being purchased by Wells Fargo Municipal Capital Strategies, LLC and held as Bank Bought Bonds. The Series 2016 Bonds will bear interest at a fixed rate not to exceed 3% per annum for the initial Direct Purchase Period ending January 2, 2020. The 2016 Bonds have a final maturity date of January 1, 2033. The refunding of the Series 2005A Bonds is being done for interest rate savings.

The Bonds are rated A3 by Moody's and A by Standard and Poor's Ratings Services. Nexsen Pruet, PLLC served as bond counsel. Kutak Rock LLP served as counsel to the Purchaser. US Bank National Association serves as Bond Trustee for the Issue.

## 10. Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community - \$13,159,000

On December 15, 2016, the Commission issued its \$13,159,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community), Series 2016 dated as of the date of delivery (December 15, 2016). The proceeds of the Series 2016 Bonds are being used, together with other available funds to (1) refund \$14,510,000 of the outstanding North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community) Series 2007 and (2) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2016 Bonds. The Series 2016 Bonds are being purchased by Branch Banking and Trust Company and held as Bank Bought Bonds to maturity. The Series 2016 Bonds have a final maturity date of January 1, 2031 and will bear interest at 68% of one-month LIBOR plus 0.845%. The refunding of the Series 2007 Bonds is being done for interest rate savings.

Ziegler served as Placement Agent for the Issue. Robinson Bradshaw & Hinson, P.A. served as bond counsel. Moore & Van Allen, PLLC served as counsel to the Purchaser. Branch Banking and Trust Company serves as Bond Trustee for the Issue.

## 11. Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community - \$26,440,000

On December 30, 2016, the Commission reissued for federal tax purposes its \$28,875,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community) Series 2010 outstanding in the amount of \$26,440,000. In connection with the reissuance, the bank holder (Branch Banking and Trust Company) and Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community agreed to change the interest rate from 68% of one-month LIBOR plus 1.30% per annum to 68% of one-month LIBOR plus 0.859% per annum and extend the Bank-Bought Minimum Holding Period from December 20, 2023 to December 30, 2028. The Series 2010 Bonds have a final maturity date of January 1, 2038.

Ziegler served as Placement Agent for the Issue. Robinson Bradshaw & Hinson, P.A. served as bond counsel. Moore & Van Allen, PLLC served as counsel to the Purchaser. Branch Banking and Trust Company serves as Bond Trustee for the Issue.

## 12. Lutheran Services for the Aging, Inc. - \$33,795,000

On March 1, 2017, the Commission issued its \$33,795,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Lutheran Services for the Aging, Inc.), Series 2017 dated as of the date of delivery (March 1, 2017). The proceeds of the Series 2017 Bonds are being used to refund (1) \$10,065,000 of the outstanding North Carolina Medical Care Commission

Variable Rate Demand Health Care Facility Revenue Bonds (Lutheran Services for the Aging, Inc.) Series 1998, (2) \$23,537,537.88 of the outstanding North Carolina Medical Care Commission Health Care Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Bonds (Lutheran Services for the Aging, Inc.) Series 2012B, and (3) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2017 Bonds. The Series 2017 Bonds are being purchased by Branch Banking and Trust Company and held as Bank Bought Bonds. The Series 2017 Bonds will bear interest at the Bank-Bought Rate of 68% of one-month LIBOR plus 1.283% per annum for the Bank Bought Minimum Holding Period ending on March 1, 2029. The refunding of the Series 1998 and 2012B Bonds was done to extend the holding period of the bonds and eliminate the letter of credit for the 1998 bonds.

The Series 2017 Bonds are not rated. BB&T Capital Markets served as Placement Agent for the Issue. McGuire Woods, LLP served as bond counsel. Moore & Van Allen, PLLC served as counsel to the Purchaser. The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A. serves as Bond Trustee for the Issue.

## 13. <u>Wayne Memorial Hospital, Inc. - \$45,000,000 and \$32,245,000</u>

On May 25, 2017, the Commission issued its (1) \$45,000,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Hospital Revenue Bonds (Wayne Memorial Hospital) Series 2017A, and (2) \$32,245,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Hospital Revenue Refunding Bonds (Wayne Memorial Hospital) Series 2017B. The proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds were used, together with other available funds, to (1) fund the cost of a surgical services renovation of 48,720 square feet at the existing hospital, along with new surgical services construction of 48,823 square feet, and the replacement of four air-handling units in the main tower penthouse, and (2) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds. The surgical project included operating rooms, hybrid operating rooms, PACU, same day surgery, central sterile, endoscopy, pre-admission/anesthesia testing, registration, surgical waiting and adjoining space areas (locker rooms, surgeon lounge, on call rooms, class rooms). The proceeds of the Series 2017B Bonds were used to (1) refund the \$35,720,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Variable Rate Demand Hospital Revenue Refunding (Wayne Memorial Hospital) Series 2009 Bonds outstanding in the amount of \$32,015,000 and (2) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2009 Bonds outstanding in the Series 2017B Bonds.

The Series 2017A Bonds were purchased by BB&T Community Holdings Co. as Bank Bought Bonds and issued as draw down bonds in which Wayne Memorial Hospital draws down and incurs liability as needed to fund the Project up to 18 months past May 25, 2017. The Bonds were not rated and bear interest at the rate of 68% of One-Month LIBOR plus 0.75% for the initial bank holding period of 10 years which ends May 25, 2027. The final stated maturity date is July 1, 2049.

The Series 2017B Bonds were purchased by BB&T Community Holdings Co. as Bank Bought Bonds. The Bonds were not rated and bear interest at the rate of 68% of One-Month LIBOR plus 0.68% for the initial bank holding period of 7 years which ends May 25, 2024. The final stated maturity date is July 1, 2035.

Ponder & Co. served as Financial Advisor for the transaction. McGuire Woods, LLP served as bond counsel. Nelson Mullins Riley & Scarborough LLP served as counsel to the Hospital. Moore & Van Allen

PLLC served as counsel to the Purchaser of the bonds. Branch Banking and Trust Company served as Bond Trustee.

## 14. Aldersgate United Methodist Retirement Community, Inc. – \$19,080,000 and \$15,712,645

On May 31, 2017, the Commission issued its \$19,080,000 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Aldersgate) Series 2017A dated as of the date of delivery (May 31, 2017). The proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds are being used to (1) finance, and through the refunding of a commercial loan, refinance the costs of constructing, renovating, equipping and furnishing an approximately 43,000 square foot community center and the addition of approximately 14,000 square feet to the existing community center (the "New Community Center") and to acquire a parcel of land, (2) fund a debt service reserve fund, (3) pay a portion of the interest accruing on the Series 2017A Bonds during construction of the New Community Center and (4) finance certain costs of issuance relating to bonds.

The Series 2017 Bonds are not rated. The \$3,460,000 Serial Bonds maturing on July 1, in the years 2020-2027 and carry interest rates ranging from 3.00% to 3.625% and yields ranging from 2.130% to 3.680%. The \$2,710,000 Term Bonds due July 1, 2032 have an interest rate of 4.125% and a yield of 4.220% are subject to sinking fund redemption in the years 2028-2032. The \$3,340,000 Term Bonds due July 1, 2037 have an interest rate of 4.50% and a yield of 4.590% are subject to sinking fund redemption in the years 2033-2037. The \$9,570,000 Term Bonds due July 1, 2047 have an interest rate of 5.00 % and a yield of 4.550% are subject to sinking fund redemption in the years 2038-2047.

BB&T Capital Markets served as Underwriter for the Issue. Harris Beach, PLLC served as counsel to the underwriters. Parker Poe Adams & Bernstein LLP served as bond counsel. The Bank of Mellon Trust Company, N.A. serves as Bond Trustee. Clifton Larson Allen served as feasibility consultant for the Issue.

On May 31, 2017, the Commission issued its \$15,712,644.51 North Carolina Medical Care Commission Retirement Facilities First Mortgage Revenue Refunding Bonds (Aldersgate) Series 2017B dated as of the date of delivery (May 31, 2017). The proceeds of the Series 2017B Bonds are being used to (1) finance the cost of constructing, equipping, furnishing and marketing 62 new independent living units in three, three-story buildings (collectively being approximately 100,000 square feet) which will include parking and other routine capital improvements to buildings throughout the Corporation's campus, (2) pay a portion of the interest accruing on the Series 2017B Bonds and (4) finance certain costs of issuance relating to bonds.

The Series 2017B Bonds are being purchased by STI Institutional & Government, Inc. and held as Bank Bought Bonds. The Series 2017B Bonds will bear interest at the Bank-Bought Rate of 67% of one-month LIBOR plus 3.00% per annum until the completion date of the project. After the completion date of the project, the Series 2017B Bond will bear interest at the Bank-Bought Rate of 67% of one-month LIBOR plus an Applicable Spread Credit Range of 2.20% to 2.90% determined by Aldersgate's quarterly Debt to Capitalization Ratio to be determined on March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31. The Bank Bought Minimum Holding Period is from the date of closing until May 31, 2027 and the Bonds have a final maturity date of June 1, 2044.

The Series 2017 Bonds are not rated. BB&T Capital Markets served as Placement Agent for the Issue. Harris Beach, PLLC served as counsel to the underwriters. Parker Poe Adams & Bernstein LLP served as bond counsel. Moore & Van Allen, PLLC served as counsel to the Purchaser. The Bank of Mellon Trust Company, N.A. serves as Bond Trustee. Clifton Larson Allen served as feasibility consultant for the Issue.
