### **REVIEW CRITERIA**

G.S. 131E-183(a): The Department shall review all applications utilizing the criteria outlined in this subsection and shall determine that an application is either consistent with or not in conflict with these criteria before a certificate of need for the proposed project shall be issued.

(1) The proposed project shall be consistent with applicable policies and need determinations in the State Medical Facilities Plan, the need determination of which constitutes a determinative limitation on the provision of any health service, health service facility, health service facility beds, dialysis stations, operating rooms, or home health offices that may be approved.

Pitt County Memorial Hospital, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "the applicant" d/b/a/ ECU Health Medical Center proposes a cost overrun (COR) for Project ID #Q-12251-22 (develop a 6<sup>th</sup> GI endoscopy room at Vidant Medical Center). In Project ID # Q-12251-23 the facility was named Vidant Medical Center (VMC). The facility has been renamed ECU Health Medical Center (EHMC). The facility is part of the ECU Health System.

The parent company is University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina, Inc. d/b/a ECU Health (ECUH).

A certificate of need was issued on January 5, 2023, for Project I.D. #Q-12251-22 and authorized a capital cost of \$664,650. The current application proposes a capital cost increase of \$500,000 over the previously approved capital cost for a total combined capital cost of \$1,164,650. The cost overrun application is necessary due to a need to run medical gas lines not originally planned to the proposed GI endoscopy procedures to support more complex GI endoscopy procedures. The applicant proposes no material change in scope from the originally approved project in this application.

The applicant proposes a COR for Project ID #Q-12251-22 (develop a 6th GI Endoscopy Room).

Project ID #Q-12251-22 was conforming to this criterion and the applicant proposes no changes in the current application which would affect that determination.

Based on that review, the Agency concludes that the application is conforming to this criterion for all the reasons described above.

Project ID #Q-12251-22 was conforming to this criterion and the applicant proposes no changes in the current application which would affect that determination.

Project ID# Q-12251-22 proposed to develop no more than one additional GI endoscopy room for a total of no more than six GI endoscopy rooms upon project completion. A certificate of need was issued on January 5, 2023 for Project I.D. #Q-12251-22 and authorized a capital cost of \$664,650. The current application proposes a capital cost increase of \$500,000 over the

previously approved capital cost for a total combined capital cost of \$1,164,650. The cost overrun application is necessary due to a need to run medical gas lines not originally planned to the proposed GI endoscopy procedures to support more complex GI endoscopy procedures. The applicant proposes no material change in scope from the originally approved project in this application.

# **Patient Origin**

In Project ID# Q-12251-22, the Agency determined the applicant had adequately identified the projected patient origin for the facility. The applicant proposes no changes in the current application which would affect that determination.

### **Analysis of Need**

In Section Q, Form F.1b, the applicant provides a summary of the capital cost approved in Project ID# Q-12251-22, the changes proposed in this application, and the new projected capital cost, as shown in the table below.

In Section C, pages 43-44, and Section E, pages 50-51 the applicant explains why it believes the proposed increase in capital cost is necessary to develop the proposed project:

- EHMC providers are, more recently, encountering an increased number of GI patients who require, or are likely to require, general anesthesia during endoscopy procedures.
- The many patients for whom EHMC provides GI endoscopy services cannot be treated at outpatient based ambulatory provider offices due to complexity.
- Two of EHMC's six existing or approved GI endoscopy rooms are not currently equipped or proposed to be equipped with sufficient medical gas lines to handle more complex GI endoscopy cases.

The information is reasonable and adequately supported based on the following:

- The applicant adequately explains why additional costs are necessary to develop the proposed project.
- The applicant provides line drawings of the proposed changes in Exhibit 9.

### **Projected Utilization**

In Section C.8, page 43, the applicant confirms that projected utilization is not expected to be different from what was projected in the previously approved project. In Project ID# Q-12251-22, the Agency determined the applicant had adequately identified the projected utilization for the facility. The applicant proposes no changes in the current application which would affect that determination.

# **Access to Medically Underserved Groups**

The application for Project ID# Q-12251-22 adequately demonstrated the extent to which all residents of the area, including underserved groups, were likely to have access to the proposed services. The applicant proposes no changes in the current application which would affect that determination.

Based on that review, the Agency concludes that the application is conforming to this criterion for all the reasons described above.

This Criterion was found to be "NA" in Project ID #Q-12251-22 and the applicant proposes no changes in the current application which would affect that determination.

The applicant proposes a COR for Project ID #Q-12251-22 (develop a 6th GI Endoscopy Room).

In Section E, pages 50-51, the applicant describes the alternatives it considered and explains why each alternative is either more costly or less effective than the alternative proposed in this application to meet the need. The alternatives considered were:

- Maintain the Status Quo. The applicant determined that this was not the most effective
  alternative as providers are, more recently, encountering an increased number of GI
  patients who require, or are likely to require, general anesthesia during endoscopy
  procedures. Not adding the medical gas lines would have a negative impact on quality,
  access and cost.
- Shift patients to ECEC or Another Private Provider. The applicant determined that this was not the most effective alternative as many patients for whom EHMC provides GI endoscopy services cannot be treated at outpatient based ambulatory provider offices due to complexity.

The applicant adequately demonstrates that the alternative proposed in this application is the most effective alternative to meet the need for the following reasons:

- The applicant proposes to develop the project as approved in Project I.D. #Q-12251-22 and simply add the medical gas lines to accommodate certain patients/procedures.
- The application is conforming to all statutory and regulatory review criteria.
- The applicant provides credible information to explain why it believes the proposed project is the most effective alternative.

Based on that review, the Agency concludes that the application is conforming to this criterion for the reasons stated above. Therefore, the application is approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Pitt County Memorial Hospital, Inc. (hereinafter certificate holder) shall materially comply with all representations made in the certificate of need application.
- 2. The certificate holder shall develop no more than one additional GI endoscopy room for a total of no more than 6 GI endoscopy rooms at ECU Health Medical Center.
- 3. Upon completion of the project, ECU Health Medical Center, shall be licensed for no more than six GI endoscopy rooms.
- 4. The total combined capital expenditure for this project and Project ID# Q-12251-22 is \$1,164,650, an increase of \$500,000 over the capital cost of \$654,650 previously approved in Project I.D. #Q-12251-22.

# 5. Progress Reports:

- a. Pursuant to G.S. 131E-189(a), the certificate holder shall submit periodic reports on the progress being made to develop the project consistent with the timetable and representations made in the application on the Progress Report form provided by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section. The form is available online at: https://info.ncdhhs.gov/dhsr/coneed/progressreport.html.
- b. The certificate holder shall complete all sections of the Progress Report form.
- c. The certificate holder shall describe in detail all steps taken to develop the project since the last progress report and should include documentation to substantiate each step taken as available.
- d. The first progress report shall be due on October 15, 2024.
- 6. The certificate holder shall not acquire as part of this project any equipment that is not included in the project's proposed capital expenditures in Section Q of the application and that would otherwise require a certificate of need.
- 7. For the first three years of operation following completion of the project, the certificate holder shall not increase charges more than 5% of the charges projected in Section Q of the application without first obtaining a determination from the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section that the proposed increase is in material compliance with the representations in the certificate of need application.

- 8. The certificate holder shall acknowledge acceptance of and agree to comply with all conditions stated herein to the Agency in writing prior to issuance of the certificate of need.
- (5) Financial and operational projections for the project shall demonstrate the availability of funds for capital and operating needs as well as the immediate and long-term financial feasibility of the proposal, based upon reasonable projections of the costs of and charges for providing health services by the person proposing the service.

# **Capital and Working Capital Costs**

In Project I.D. #Q-12251-22 the applicant projected, and the project was approved for, a capital cost of \$654,650. The current application proposes a capital cost increase of \$500,000 which exceeds the 115 percent statutory limit for capital expenditures in an approved project.

The following table compares the capital cost approved in Project ID# Q-12251-22, the changes proposed in this application, and the new projected capital costs, as reported in Form F.1b in Section Q.

In Section C.8, pages 43-44, the applicant states the increase in capital expenditure is necessary due to a need to run medical gas lines not originally planned to the proposed GI endoscopy procedures to support more complex GI endoscopy procedures as EHMC providers have encountered an increase in patients who require, or are likely to require, more complex sedation/anesthesia. The applicant proposes no material change in scope from the originally approved project in this application.

In the application for Project ID #Q-12251-22, the applicant projects no working capital costs as any start-up costs and initial operating expenses will be considered as ongoing operational costs for EHMC. The current application projects no changes that would affect the determination of no working capital costs.

# **Availability of Funds**

A certificate of need was issued on January 5, 2023 for Project I.D. #Q-12251-22 and authorized a capital cost of \$664,650. In Project ID #Q-12251-22, the Agency determined that the applicant adequately demonstrated that it had sufficient funds available for capital needs of the project. The current application proposed a capital cost increase of \$500,000 over the previously approved capital cost for a total combined capital cost.

In Section F.5, page 58, the applicant states that the capital cost will be funded as shown in the table below.

The applicant adequately demonstrates the availability of sufficient funds for the capital needs of the project based on the following:

- Exhibit 7 contains a letter dated October 11, 2023, from the Chief Financial Officer for ECU Health, authorizing the use of accumulated reserves for the capital needs of the project.
- The applicant provides a copy of the combined audited financial statements of ECUH in Exhibit 8 documenting that it has adequate cash and assets to fund the capital cost of the proposed project.

### **Financial Feasibility**

In Project ID# Q-12251-22, the applicant projected revenues would exceed operating expense during the first three years of the project following project completion. The Agency determined Project ID##Q-12251-22 had demonstrated the financial feasibility of the proposal was based on reasonable projections of costs and charges. The applicant is not proposing any changes that would affect that determination.

- The applicant adequately demonstrates sufficient funds for the operating needs of the proposal and that the financial feasibility of the proposal is based upon reasonable projections of revenues and operating expenses for all the reasons described above.
- (6) The applicant shall demonstrate that the proposed project will not result in unnecessary duplication of existing or approved health service capabilities or facilities.

In Section K.5, page 71, the applicant states that the project involves renovating 360 square feet of existing space. Line drawings are provided in Exhibit 9.

On page 72, the applicant adequately explains how the cost, design and means of construction represent the most reasonable alternative for the proposal based on the fact that the renovations are minor, and only involve adding medical gas lines to existing space already designed for endoscopy procedures.

On page 72, the applicant adequately explains why the proposal will not unduly increase the costs to the applicant of providing the proposed services or the costs and charges to the public for the proposed services since the renovations are minor, and the space is existing and already equipped and designed for endoscopy procedures. Furthermore, the proposed project does not change the financial projections of the approved project (Project ID # Q-12251-22).

In Section B.21, pages 30-31, and in Section K, page 72 applicant identifies and describes any applicable energy saving features that will be incorporated into the construction plans.

In Section Q, Form O Facilities, the applicant identifies the related hospital and ambulatory surgical centers (ASCs) facilities located in North Carolina owned, operated or managed by the applicant or a related entity. The applicant identifies a total of ten such facilities located in North Carolina.

In Section O, page 84, the applicant states that, during the 18 months immediately preceding submission of the application, they have no knowledge of incidents related to quality of care at any of its facilities. After reviewing and considering information provided by the applicant and considering the quality of care provided at all ten facilities, the applicant provided sufficient evidence that quality care has been provided in the past. Therefore, the application is conforming to this criterion.

G.S. 131E-183 (b): The Department is authorized to adopt rules for the review of particular types of applications that will be used in addition to those criteria outlined in subsection (a) of this section and may vary according to the purpose for which a particular review is being conducted or the type of health service reviewed. No such rule adopted by the Department shall require an academic medical center teaching hospital, as defined by the State Medical Facilities Plan, to demonstrate that any facility or service at another hospital is being appropriately utilized in order for that academic medical center teaching hospital to be approved for the issuance of a certificate of need to develop any similar facility or service.
