Two compete for dialysis stations in Macon County

RALEIGH – Two applicants have filed competing proposals with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop dialysis stations in Macon County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held at 12:30 p.m. on May 15 at the Macon County Courthouse, Courtroom B, 5 West Main St., Franklin.

The 2012 State Medical Facilities Plan has identified a need for seven additional dialysis stations in Macon County. The two proposals are:

- FMC Macon County proposes to develop a new seven station end stage renal disease facility in Franklin. The project is expected to cost \$1,084,522.
- Macon County Dialysis proposes to a new seven station end stage renal disease facility in Franklin. The project is expected to cost \$967,776.
