Ten compete to open new home health agencies in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH – Ten proposals have filed with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to establish a new Medicare-certified home health agency in Mecklenburg County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held at 1 p.m. on Sept. 20 in Room 267 on the 2nd Floor of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East 4th St., Charlotte.

The 2012 State Medical Facilities Plan has identified a need for two additional Medicare-certified home health agencies in Mecklenburg County. Each of the 10 proposals seeks to develop a Medicare-certified home health agency in Mecklenburg County. The providers and their anticipated project costs are as follows:

- AssistedCare of the Carolinas, \$31,874.
- Continuum Home Care of Charlotte, \$92,270.
- Emerald Care, \$111,713.
- HealthKeeperz of Mecklenburg, \$62,400.
- Healthy @ Home – Carolinas Medical Center, \$450,000.
- J & D Health Care Services, \$6,000.
- Maxim Healthcare Services, \$65,000.
- UniHealth Home Health, \$196,196.
- Vizion One, Inc., \$115,099.
- Well Care Home Health of Mecklenburg, \$110,000.
