Four in Triangle compete for inpatient rehabilitation beds

RALEIGH -- Four competing applications have been filed with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop inpatient rehabilitation beds in the Triangle area.

A public hearing for these projects will be held at 1 p.m. on Oct. 16, in Room 104 of the Brown Building, 801 Biggs Drive on the campus of Dorothea Dix Hospital in Raleigh.

The 2012 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP) identifies a need for 20 inpatient rehabilitation beds in Health Service Area (HSA) IV, which includes Wake, Durham, Orange, Johnston, Chatham, Franklin, Granville, Lee, Person, Vance and Warren counties. A brief description of each proposed project follows:

- UNC Hospitals proposes to develop 12 new inpatient rehabilitation beds at its main campus on Manning Drive in Chapel Hill for a total of 42 inpatient rehabilitation beds.
- WakeMed proposes to develop 12 new inpatient rehabilitation beds and replace 29 existing beds at its existing location on New Bern Avenue near I-440 for a total of 110 inpatient rehabilitation beds unpon completion of this project and a 14-bed project approved in 2011.
- Duke Raleigh Hospital proposes to develop a 12 bed inpatient rehabilitation unit at its location on Wake Forest Road near I-440 in Raleigh.
- Johnston Memorial Hospital proposes to develop an eight-bed inpatient rehabilitation unit at Johnston Medical Center-Smithfield on North Bright Leaf Boulevard. If approved, UNC Hospitals will manage the rehab unit for Johnston Medical Center.
