BMA to develop dialysis facility in Louisburg

RALEIGH – Bio-Medical Applications of North Carolina, Inc. d/b/a FMC Tar River has filed an application with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop a 10-station dialysis facility in Louisburg in Franklin County by transferring seven stations from BMA Zebulon and three stations from FMC Eastern Wake.

A public hearing for this project will be held at 1 p.m. on May 17 in the Conference Room at the Franklin County Public Library, Youngsville Branch, 218 U.S. Highway 1-A South in Youngsville.

The project is expected to cost \$1.5 million and to be complete in December 2014.
