Two compete for PET scanner in Forsyth County

RALEIGH – Two applicants have filed competing proposals with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to acquire a PET scanner in Forsyth County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held at 11 a.m. on July 19 in the Council Chambers, Kernersville Town Hall, 134 East Mountain St., Kernersville.

The 2013 State Medical Facilities Plan identifies a need for one additional PET scanner in HSA II, which includes Caswell, Alamance, Rockingham, Guilford, Randolph, Stokes, Forsyth, Davidson, Surry, Yadkin and Davie counties. Each proposal seeks to acquire a PET scanner to be located in Forsyth County. The proposals are described as follows:

- Forsyth Medical Center proposes to acquire a third PET scanner which will be located in Kernersville. The project is expected to cost \$1.6 million and to be complete by January 2017.
- North Carolina Baptist Hospital proposes to acquire a second PET scanner which will be located in Winston-Salem. The project is expected to cost \$1.6 million and to be complete by July 2017.
