Three compete for hospice home care agency in Granville County

RALEIGH – Three applicants have filed competing plans with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop a new hospice home care agency in Granville County.

A public hearing for this project will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Oct. 14 at the Granville County Public Library, Richard H. Thornton Conference Room, 210 Main St., Oxford.

The 2013 State Medical Facilities Plan has identified a need for one additional hospice home care office in Granville County. Each applicant proposes to develop a new hospice home care office in Granville County. The estimated costs and completion dates for each applicant are as follows:

- Gentiva Hospice estimates that the project will cost \$107,000 and that the services will be available in October 2014.
- Granville-Vance District Health Department estimates that the project will cost \$143,200 and that the services will be available in July 2014.
- Continuum Home Care and Hospice of Granville County estimates that the project will cost \$34,250 and that the services will be available in June 2014.
