Three compete for acute care beds in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH – Three hospitals have filed competing applications with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation in response to a need determination in the 2013 State Medical Facilities Plan for 40 additional acute care beds in Mecklenburg County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held Dec. 17 at 9 a.m. in Room 267 of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East 4th St., Charlotte. A brief description of each proposal follows:

- Novant Health Huntersville Medical Center proposes to add 17 acute care beds. The project is expected to cost \$2 million.
- Carolinas Medical Center-Mercy proposes to add 34 acute care beds. The project is expected to cost \$2 million.
- Carolinas Medical Center-University proposes to add six acute care beds. The project is expected to cost \$349,800.
