DVA Healthcare asks to develop two dialysis facilities in Charlotte

RALEIGH – DVA Healthcare Renal Care has filed applications with the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section of DHHS' Division of Health Service Regulation to develop two new 10-station end stage renal disease facilities in Charlotte.

University City Dialysis will be developed by relocating dialysis stations from North Charlotte Dialysis. The project is expected to cost \$2.5 million and to be complete in Jan. 2018. A public hearing for this project will be held Dec. 17 at 10 a.m. in Room 270/271 of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East 4th St., Charlotte.

Brookshire Dialysis will be developed by relocating dialysis stations from Charlotte Dialysis. The project is expected to cost \$3.5 million and to be complete in Jan. 2018. A public hearing for this project will be held Dec. 17 at 11 a.m. in Room 270/271 of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East 4th St., Charlotte.

Anyone may file written comments concerning these proposals. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Dec. 1.
