Two dialysis providers ask to develop new facilities in Raleigh

RALEIGH – Total Renal Care of North Carolina and Fresenius Medical Care of North Carolina have filed non-competitive applications with N.C. Department of Health and Human Services to develop 10-station dialysis facilities in Raleigh by relocating dialysis stations from existing Wake County dialysis facilities.

The Total Renal Care project is expected to cost \$2.4 million and to be complete in January 2018. The Fresenius project is expected to cost \$1.6 million and to be complete in December 2017.

A public hearing for these projects will be held April 19, 2016 at 11 a.m. in Conference Room 026 of the Edgerton Building on the Dorothea Dix Campus, 809 Ruggles Drive, Raleigh.

Anyone may file written comments concerning this proposal. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on March 31.
