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Two compete to develop dental single specialty surgical facility in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH – Two applicants have filed competing Certificate of Need applications with the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services to develop a dental outpatient surgical facility in Mecklenburg County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held Aug. 11 at 11 a.m. in Community Room B, Beatties Ford Regional Library, 2412 Beatties Ford Road, Charlotte.

The 2016 State Medical Facilities Plan has identified a need for one dental surgical facility demonstration project to serve Region 2, which includes, Cabarrus, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Rowan, Stanley and Union counties. The proposals are as follows:

- Surgical Center for Dental Professionals of Charlotte proposes to develop a facility with two operating rooms and two procedure rooms on Judson Avenue in Charlotte. The project is expected to cost \$3.7 million and to be completed in January 2018.
- Carolinas Center for Ambulatory Dentistry proposes to develop a facility with two operating rooms and two procedure rooms on Rozzelles Ferry Road in Charlotte. The project is expected to cost \$3.3 million and to be completed in March 2018.

Anyone may file written comments concerning the proposals. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Aug. 1.
