PUBLIC NOTICE

Three Facilities Compete to Develop Acute Care Beds in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH — Three facilities have filed competing certificate of need applications with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services to develop a total of 60 acute care beds in response to a need determination for Mecklenburg County in the 2017 State Medical Facilities Plan.

- Carolinas HealthCare System Pineville proposes to add 15 acute care beds to its existing facility for a total of 147 acute care beds. The project is expected to cost \$1.1 million and would be complete in April 2018.
- Carolinas Medical Center proposes to add 45 acute care beds to its existing facility for a total of 1,055 acute care beds. The project is expected to cost \$1.2 million and would be complete in April 2018.
- Novant Health Presbyterian Medical Center proposes two projects: 1) to add 18 acute care beds and 2) to add 21 Level IV NICU beds to its existing facility for a total of 524 acute care beds. The projects are collectively expected to cost \$14.3 million and would be complete in January 2020.

A public hearing for these projects will be held Aug. 11 at 11 a.m. in Room 267, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 E. Fourth St., Charlotte.

Anyone may file written comments concerning these proposals. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on July 31.
