Total Renal Care Seeks Approval for Dialysis Facility in Clayton

RALEIGH — Total Renal Care of North Carolina doing business as Clayton Dialysis Center has filed a certificate of need application with the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services seeking approval to relocate six dialysis stations from Wilson Dialysis and four from Forest Hills Dialysis in Wilson County to develop a 10-station dialysis facility in Clayton.

Clayton Dialysis Center proposes to develop a 5,100 square foot facility at 2196 Highway 42 in Clayton. In addition to in-center dialysis, Clayton Dialysis Center proposes to offer home hemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis training and support.

The project is expected to cost \$2.1 million and would be complete in June 2019.

A public hearing for the project will be held Nov.14 at 11 a.m. at Johnston Community College, Tart Building, Room D108, 245 College Road, Smithfield.

Anyone may file written comments concerning this proposal. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Oct. 31.
