Two Applicants Compete for Durham/Caswell Service Area Acute Care Beds

RALEIGH — Two applicants have filed competing certificate of need applications with the N. C. Department of Health and Human Services to develop acute care beds in response to the need determination for 96 new acute care beds in the Durham and Caswell counties service area.

The two proposals are as follows:

- North Carolina Specialty Hospital proposes to develop six acute care beds at the existing facility in Durham. The project is expected to cost \$100,000 and be completed in December 2018.
- Duke University Hospital proposes to develop 96 acute care beds at the existing facility in Durham. The project is expected to cost \$29.1 million and be developed in phases to be completed in July 2023.

A public hearing for these proposed projects will be held Dec. 20 at 11 a.m., 2nd Floor Commissioners' Chambers, Old Historic Courthouse, 200 East Main St. in Durham.

Anyone may file written comments concerning this proposal. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Dec. 1.
