Two Compete for Hospice Home Care Office in Cumberland County

RALEIGH — Two competing certificate of need applications have been filed with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services to develop a hospice home care office in Cumberland County.

The proposals are as follows:

- Well Care Hospice of the Eastern Carolinas in Wilmington proposes to develop a new hospice home care agency. The project is expected to cost \$75,000 and would be completed in October 2019.
- Home Health and Hospice Care in Goldsboro proposes to develop a new hospice home care agency. The project is expected to cost \$53,000 and would be completed in October 2019.

A public hearing for these projects will be held Aug. 16 at 1 p.m. in the meeting room of the Cliffdale Regional Branch Library, 6882 Cliffdale Road, Fayetteville.

Anyone may file written comments concerning this proposal. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on July 31.
