Applicant Seeks to Develop Two Dialysis Facilities in Charlotte

RALEIGH — Renal Treatment Centers – Mid-Atlantic Inc. has filed two certificate of need applications with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services to relocate dialysis stations from existing end stage renal disease facilities in Charlotte to develop two 10-station end-stage renal disease facilities.

Ten dialysis stations would be relocated from North Charlotte Dialysis to develop Mountain Island Lake Dialysis in Charlotte, and 10 dialysis stations would be relocated from Charlotte Dialysis to develop Renaissance Park Dialysis in Charlotte.

Each project is expected to cost \$2.4 million and would be completed in January 2021.

A public hearing for these projects will be held Nov. 9 at 10 a.m. in Room 278 of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East 4th St., Charlotte.

Anyone may file written comments concerning these proposals. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Oct. 31.
