Re: UNC Hospitals' No Review Request Regarding C-Section Room Usage

Ms. Mitchell and Mr. McKillip,

University of North Carolina Hospitals (UNC Hospitals or "UNCH") provides this letter requesting a determination by the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Service Regulation, Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section (the "Agency") that UNCH's occasional use of a C-Section room for birthing related procedures other than C-Sections does not implicate certificate of need ("CON") review and does not require a CON.

UNCH is licensed to operate three (3) dedicated C-Section rooms on its main campus in Chapel Hill. On occasion, UNCH confronts challenges in handling urgent, unscheduled surgeries related to birthing issues that are not technically covered as procedures explicitly permissible to be performed in dedicated C-Section rooms in light of the CON limits on such rooms.¹ These urgent birthing cases often require a very quick response by surgical birthing staff to provide necessary care for patients and transport of the patient from Labor and Delivery to an operating room in the hospital's main OR suite is less than optimal for patient care and safety.

By way of example, the following categories of cases constitute the type of urgent, unscheduled birthing-related case that might be performed in one of UNCH's three C-Section rooms:

- Dilation and Curettage post-delivery
- Dilation and Evacuation post-induction
- External Cephalic Version with reflex to C-Section

Chapter 6 of the Proposed 2024 State Medical Facilities Plan states that "[a] dedicated C-Section OR shall only be used to perform C-Sections and other procedures performed on the patient in the same visit to the C-Section operating room, such that a patient receiving another procedure at the same time as the C-Section would not need to be moved to a different OR for the second procedure."

- Complicated/Operative vaginal deliveries
- Exploratory laparotomy post-delivery
- Cerclage
- Bilateral tubal ligation
- Fetal procedures

To address these patient needs and to ensure a safety net for urgent birthing cases, UNCH proposes the following:

- 1. For the vast majority of the time, UNCH will continue to use its three C-Section rooms exclusively as C-Section rooms; and
- 2. For a small fraction of the time in any given week or month, UNCH may use one of its C-Section rooms at a time to perform urgent birthing cases.

This request seeks confirmation that UNCH can, in these urgent situations, utilize any of its three C-Section rooms for urgent birthing cases a small fraction of the time with only one utilized in this manner at a time. As described above, UNCH believes that the proposed use of a C-Section room for urgent birthing cases does not trigger the development of a new institutional health service nor will it result in any additional capital or operating costs, higher patient charges, or any new health services being performed.

In consideration of the above, UNCH requests written confirmation that this proposal does not require CON review.
