I, Drexdal Pratt, as Director of the Division of Health Service Regulation, North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services ("Department" or "Agency"), do hereby issue this Declaratory Ruling pursuant to North Carolina General Statute § 150B-4 and 10A NCAC 14A .0103 under the authority granted me by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services.

RHA Health Services ("RHA") has requested a declaratory ruling for Project I.D. No. B-8223-08 ("Project") allowing for a change in the location of a six-bed Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded group home. This ruling will be binding upon the Department and the entity requesting it, as long as the material facts stated herein are accurate. This ruling pertains only to the matters referenced herein. Except as provided by N.C.G.S. § 150B-4, the Department expressly reserves the right to make a prospective change in the interpretation of the statutes and regulations at issue in this Declaratory Ruling. Scott Little, Vice President of Housing and Asset Management for RHA has requested this ruling on behalf of RHA and has provided the material facts upon which this ruling is based.

STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

On January 22, 2010, the CON Section issued a Certificate of Need for Project I.D. No. B-8223-08 authorizing RHA to develop a six-bed Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally

Retarded group home. The approved site is located at 30 Lance Road in Arden, North Carolina (Buncombe County).

Since issuance of the Certificate of Need, the original property where the facility was to be located is no longer available. RHA now has identified a one-acre site for the group home on Emory Road in Asheville, North Carolina (Buncombe County) – specifically, Lots 6B & 6C at plat book 0024, page 0090. RHA represents that the new site has been determined by the City of Asheville to meet the definition of a family care home for zoning purposes so long as RHA follows special requirements set forth in a letter from the City. Water and sewer are available at the site. The cost of the new site is \$145,000, which is less than the \$149,900 cost of the original site. The site is accessible to interstates 40 and 240 and is located 15 minutes or less from a hospital, physician offices, the fire department, ambulance service, shopping, a pharmacy and parks and recreation.

ANALYSIS

The CON law would require a full review of RHA's proposed change of site if that change were to represent a material change in the physical location or scope of the project. N.C.G.S. § 131E-181(a). The proposed change of the site for RHA's project does not constitute a material change in the physical location or the scope of the proposed project. The proposed site is large enough for the project and meets zoning and other requirements. It is located within Buncombe County, is accessible to major interstates and is near key support services. Development at this site will result in cost savings of approximately \$4900.

N.C.G.S. § 131E-189(b) allows the Agency to withdraw RHA's Certificate of Need if RHA fails to develop the project in a manner consistent with the representations made in the application or with any conditions that were placed on the Certificate of Need. RHA will not be

developing its project in a manner that is materially different from the representations made in its

application, nor will it be developing its project in a manner that is inconsistent with any of the

conditions that were placed on its Certificate of Need.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, assuming the statements of fact in the request to be true, I

conclude that the substitution of the Emory Road location in Asheville as a site for RHA's group

home, Project I.D. No. B-8223-08, will not constitute a material change in the physical location

or scope of the project, will not violate N.C.G.S. § 131E-181, and will not constitute a failure to

satisfy a condition of the Certificate of Need in violation of N.C.G.S. § 131E-189(b).
