Dear Dr. Pulliam,

I strongly support CarePartners Hospice & Palliative Care's request for the special needs petition for five additional inpatient hospice beds for Buncombe County, NC in the 2010 State Medical Facilities Plan.

The needs of the inpatient dying patient are the most demanding and challenging, and a dedicated inpatient multidisciplinary staff, involving doctors, nurses, chaplains, social workers, aides and volunteers, is the optimal support system for such care.

This level of care is the "gold standard" of intensive end-of-life care when families and/or caregivers cannot meet their loved ones' needs at home. Our facility has been operating at full capacity for some time, and, having recently moved from Macon County, I found the prospect of referring patients to Buncombe County as delayed or just unrealistic because of waiting lists.

As Medical Director of CarePartners Hospice & Palliative Care, I appreciate the need for additional beds to better meet the needs of our community, as well as those surrounding, and I fully support the addition of five additional inpatient beds to the CarePartners Hospice Solace Center.
