Dear Dr. Ullrich:

I am the Stroke Program Coordinator at Novant Health Presbyterian Medical Center. As you may be aware, in Mecklenburg County there is only one provider of inpatient rehabilitation services. In addition, in the eight counties of HSA III, one provider controls 95% of existing rehabilitation beds.

As a Stroke Coordinator, I have often witnessed extended delays in the admission of NHPMC patients to the existing inpatient rehabilitation center as a result of their high utilization, admission criteria or pending payor source. In many cases, these patients have prolonged inpatient stays at higher cost and with less potential to achieve their optimal recovery. As a result, they are at increased risk for readmission and increased, lifelong disability.

Novant Health, in partnership with HealthSouth is submitting an adjusted need determination for new rehabilitation beds in HSA III. I, and my colleagues, support the expansion of rehabilitation services in the Greater Charlotte Market. If approved, the Petition will increase access for patients currently denied timely care. This project will promote cost-effective approaches, expand access to health care services and encourage quality health care services by providing more efficient health care services to the residents of Mecklenburg County and surrounding counties.
