PETITION FOR AN ADJUSTED NEED DETERMINATION FOR AN ADDITIONAL HOSPICE HOME CARE AGENCY OR OFFICE IN HYDE COUNTY

Requested Adjustment:

Liberty Home care VII, LLC, d/b/a Liberty Home Care Services ("Liberty") seeks to expand its service line to include hospice services in Hyde County and petitions for an adjusted need determination for an additional hospice home care agency in Hyde County in the 2018 SMFP.

Liberty Home Care Background:

Liberty Home Care was established in North Carolina in 1994 with the formation of Liberty Home Care, LLC. Today, Liberty Home Care provides home health services from offices in 27 locations and hospice services from 21 locations covering various urban and rural counties in North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia.

A unique and critical component of the corporate structure of Liberty Home Care is that an institutional operational structure is not imposed on the home health agencies. The organization understands the need to operate home health agencies and hospice agencies independently and not as a department of a larger organization with rules and policies that govern in very different health care settings (for example, hospitals and other facilities). For this reason, the agencies have flourished and are expected to continue to provide quality home health services.

Liberty Home Care is led by a seasoned team of home care professionals. **Anthony J. Zizzamia, Jr., R.N., MPH**, president, has been involved in the health care field for over 40 years, commencing with home care skilled nursing visits. As an executive, he has managed clinical services for a public health department; hospital-based home care agencies; freestanding, not-for-profit home care and hospice organizations; and for-profit, freestanding companies. Mr. Zizzamia has also held board leadership positions in home care associations in North Carolina, Illinois, and Georgia. Mr. Zizzamia is a registered nurse, holds the Certification for Home & Hospice Care Executives, and earned a Master's degree in Public Health.

In addition to Mr. Zizzamia's lengthy experience, the management of Liberty Home Care has, collectively, more than 70 years of home care experience. **Holly McDonald, RN**, CHPCA, vice-president of Patient Services, is a 25-year Liberty veteran. She has worked in the hospice and home health care field for over 30 years throughout North Carolina. During her tenure at Liberty, Holly has served as a Field Nurse, Patient Care Coordinator, Operations Manager, and Senior Director for Hospice Clinical Services and has achieved a national <u>Certification as Hospice and Palliative Care A</u>dministrator. **Karen Hogan, RN**, is the senior director of Regulatory Compliance and has been with Liberty since 1996. She manages quality initiatives for Liberty's home health and hospice programs. Ms. Hogan has been involved in home care operations and quality improvement for over 25 years, with experience in home health staff nursing and clinical administrative positions with both a health department-based and a private, for-profit, freestanding agency.

Liberty Home Care's mission statement, "to provide cost effective, quality services that will achieve optimal outcomes," reflects the commitment of the company to providing quality home health services.

Reasons for the Proposed Adjustment:

Liberty recognizes the long-standing support of the Long-Term and Behavioral Health Committee and the State Health Coordinating Council with respect to petitions for adjusted need determinations. After careful assessment, Liberty has determined that there are unique circumstances in Hyde County that necessitate the development of an additional hospice home care agency. Approval of this petition will provide Liberty the opportunity to submit a Certificate of Need (CON) application during 2018 to establish a Hospice Home Care agency in Hyde County.

Liberty justifies the proposed adjusted need determination based on several factors, including:

- There currently are no licensed hospice offices actually located in Hyde County
- Extensive drive time from current hospice locations to Hyde County
- Liberty's existing home care office, which is the only licensed home care/home health provider in Hyde County
- Hyde County's population of persons age 65 and older are projected to increase at an astounding 66% between the 2010 US Census and 2030 projected census
- Unique population will never meet current SMFP threshold
- Community support for a hospice home care office in Hyde County is extremely strong

Existing Hospice Providers for Hyde County

A preferred method by many disabled and senior citizens is to remain at home and use community in-home health and/or home aide services. As of July, 2017 there was one licensed home care/home health provider in Hyde County: Liberty Home Care¹, the petitioner of this request. In addition, Community Home Care and Hospice (Beaufort County), Community Home Care and Hospice (Martin County), and Amedisys Hospice Care (Washington County) are the only entities licensed by the state of NC to provide hospice services in Hyde County. Community Home Care and Hospice (Hyde County) is also listed as an entity licensed by the state of NC to provide hospice services in Hyde County. However, they have closed the office and either terminated or moved all the employees. This is confirmed on their website, as the Hyde County (Engelhard) office is not listed as one of their serviced locations. Altogether, according to the 2017 license renewal applications for the three current entities licensed by the state to provide hospice services in Hyde County, only Amedisys Hospice Care (Washington County) served patients in Hyde County. See table 1 below, which displays the 2017 LRA data:

As the date above displays, the 3 Hospice offices currently serving Hyde County residents served a total of 42,000 days of care from their offices. However, only 1,027 days were served to Hyde County residents. That's a paltry 2.45% of the total days of care.

Geographical Access to Hyde County Residents

The Applicants feel a major reason so little of the total days of care from these facilities has been provided to Hyde County residents is because of the drive time from their current location to Hyde County. Hyde County, bordered on the south by the Pamlico Sound and the east by the Atlantic Ocean, is defined by water. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 1,424 square miles, of which 613 square miles is land and 811 square miles (57%) is water. It is the second-largest county in North Carolina by total area. However, with this large amount of water comes difficulty for outside-county employees to travel easily and quickly throughout the county.

As stated above, there is currently not a hospice office located in Hyde County. Therefore, Hyde County residents in need of hospice care must utilize out-of-county facilities. The Applicant used Google Earth to find approximate mileage and driving time from the office to the most populous townships among adults aged 65 and over. These townships were: Lake Landing Township, Fairfield Township, and the County Seat Swan Quarter². Lake Landing Township is far and away the most populated township overall as well as the most populous among adults aged 65 and over. The closest hospice office is Amedisys located in Washington County, and this office is over 64 miles away from the Lake Landing Township. That means, at a minimum, this facilities employees have to drive 1 hour and 12 minutes (one way) to give care to residents in this township. The other two facilities, located in Beaufort and Martin, are located even further away. Swan Quarter is the closest township in location to these facilities, and it is still over 44 miles and a 50 minute (one way) drive to aid residents in this area. To compare, the Applicant also utilized Google Earth to find approximate mileage and driving time from Liberty's current Home Care office, which would be the CON applicant should this petition be approved. See Table 4 and 5 below. As you can see from the tables, these drive times and total mileage would be significantly less if a hospice office was located in Hyde County.

Geographical access to hospice residents is extremely important. Many factors can come into play for an employee that must travel long distances to treat and care for these residents. Some of these factors include: weather, traffic, accidents, and expenses. For the families of these residents, stress is already high when dealing with a terminally ill family member, and worrying about the hospice employee showing up and on time should not be a concern of the family.

To conclude, adding an additional hospice home care agency in Hyde County would greatly improve the geographic access of hospice services for local citizens. Residents of Hyde County as well as employees already working in Hyde would create a reasonably accessed and much needed end-of-life service.

Demographics among the Senior Population

Although Hyde County is the second-largest county in North Carolina by total area, it is also the second-least populous county in North Carolina. However, a particularly noteworthy aspect of the Hyde County population is its age. Liberty has analyzed the local demographics and feels that the Hyde County market is strong enough to support this project. An analysis of the Hyde County population reveals a strong residents and projected growth for those aged 65+.

According to Nielsen Claritas pop-facts data ran by the Applicant, the 2017 estimated total population in Hyde County is projected to be 5,503. Even so, the overall population between 2010-2017 has gone down 5.28% and is projected to drop another 1.13% between 2017-2022.

However, of the 5,503 projected population in 2017, 1,038 (or 18.86%) are projected to be 65 and over. To compare, there were only 875 people aged 65 and over in 2010. That means there was a growth of 163 people aged 65+, or almost 19%. The growing is expected to continue, as well, as an additional 111 people aged 65+ is expected to populate this area in 2022. That is another growth of almost 12%. See Attachment 1 regarding these figures.

Moreover, according to figures from the NC Office of State Budget and Management, the population of persons age 65 and older in Hyde County is projected to grow from 875 at the time of the 2010 US Census to 1,410 by 2030, an increase of 66%. More specifically, between 2010 and 2030 the Hyde County population age 65-74 is projected to grow by 50%, the population age 75-84 by 100% and the population over age 85 by 46%. See Table 6 below, which displays this data. Also see Attachment 2, which exhibits July 1, 2010 and July 1, 2030 County Total Age Groups.

The increasing elderly population in Hyde County is essential to note. In 2014, according to the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO), approximately 84% of hospice patients were 65 years of age or older³. Thus, this population represents the most significant demographic in need of the proposed hospice office.

Unique Population will never meet SMFP Basic Needs and Assumptions

For a Hospice Home Care office need to be created in a specific county, the following basic is needed:

1) the county's deficit is 90 or more, and 2) the number of licensed hospice home care offices located in the county per 100,000 population is three or less.

The Basic assumptions to find these numbers are as follows:

1. County mortality (death) rates for the most recent years (2011-2015) are used as the basis for hospice patient need projection. The five-year death rate for 2011-2015 is used as an indicator of deaths from all sites in each county and is not affected by changes in actual deaths from year to year.

2. Because previous years' data are used as the basis for projections, the two-year trailing average growth rate in statewide number of deaths served should be calculated over the previous three years and applied to the current reported number of deaths served to project changes in the capacity of existing agencies to serve deaths from each county by the target year. Hospice deaths served will not be projected to exceed 60 percent of total deaths.

3. Median projected hospice deaths is projected by applying a projected statewide median percent of deaths served by hospice to projected deaths in each county. Projected statewide median percent of deaths served should be calculated by applying the two-year trailing average growth rate in the statewide median percent of deaths served over the previous three years to the current statewide median percent of deaths served.

While these basic assumptions and needs work for primarily all of the counties, Hyde county is unique in that its population is the 2nd smallest in North Carolina. Therefore, because the population is so small, the county will never meet the SMFP additional patient deficit threshold of 90 patients. However, even if you appropriately take out the licensed hospice office in Hyde County along with updating the reported number of hospice patient deaths to reflect the current hospice offices servicing Hyde (excluded Community Home Care and Hospice of Hyde County); Hyde County would still fall well short of the threshold. See Table 8 below.

Furthermore, to meet the threshold of a deficit of 90 or more patients in need and all else was kept equal, the county population would need to be over 20,000 and there would also need to be 0 reported hospice patient deaths. That means that the current agencies presently able to serve Hyde County could stop serving this county and there would still not be a need for a hospice office. Presently speaking, only 1 of the 3 current offices serving Hyde County provided hospice care to Hyde residents in 2016. The Applicants feel that is not reasonable to the current residents. See Table 9 below.

Community Support

Community support for a home care office in Hyde County is extremely strong. Liberty Home Care has received letters of support from: Kris Noble, Assistant County Manager and Director of Economic Development and Planning, Luana Gibbs, Interim Health Director for the Hyde County Health Department, Earl Pugh, Jr., Chair of the Board of Commissioners, and Geraldine Weatherly, Nursing Home Administrator for Cross Creek Health Care Center. These people, in conjunction with their agencies, know of the great need for local access to hospice services for residents of Hyde County.

In addition, Liberty has also received abundant support from other local leaders and organizations, all expressing their strong support for the proposed project in Hyde County. These organizations and individuals understand the great local demand for end-of-life services, and recognize the need for improved access to hospice services in Hyde County. Please see Attachment 3 regarding letters of support we have received.

Adverse Effects if No Adjustment to the Need Determination

If this petition is not approved, the need for a hospice home care agency in Hyde County will remain unmet. Residents will have to continue to rely on out of county services. Specifically speaking, due to the small population, the current agencies serving Hyde County could stop serving this county and there would still not be a need for a hospice office in the SMFP. Additionally, the population of persons age 65 and older is projected to increase at an astounding 66% between 2010 and 2030. This is important to note because, as stated before, approximately 84% of hospice patients in 2014 were 65 years of age or older.

Given the projected population growth in Hyde County among older adults and the lack of a hospice home care agency located in Hyde County, it would be practical to approve an adjusted need determination for an additional hospice home care agency in Hyde County in the 2018 SMFP.

Alternatives to the Proposed Adjustment

The following alternatives were considered:

- 1. <u>Maintain the Status Quo</u>. Maintaining the status quo puts Hyde County at risk of not receiving hospice services. This alternative was quickly dismissed.
- 2. <u>Petition for an adjusted need determination</u>. The project presented in this application is the most appropriate solution to the need for hospice services in the service area. If this petition was approved, Liberty is prepared to pursue a CON in 2018 to provide high quality, accessible home hospice services to the growing elderly patient population in Hyde County. Please see the reasons for the proposed adjustment above.

Evidence of Non-duplication Services

The approval of this petition would not result in unnecessary duplication of hospice services in Hyde County for the following reasons:

- There is currently not an agency located in Hyde County
- Of the three current entities licensed by the state to provide hospice services in Hyde County, only Amedisys Hospice Care in Washington County served patients in Hyde County.
- Hyde Counties senior population is expected to exponentially grow, therefore causing a need for additional hospice services

Safety and Quality, Access and Value

The requested adjustment is consistent with the three Basic Principles governing the development of the North Carolina State Medical Facilities Plan: Safety and Quality, Access and Value.

Safety and Quality

Liberty Home Care was established in North Carolina in 1994 with the formation of Liberty Home Care, LLC. Today, Liberty Home Care provides home care services from offices in 27 locations and hospice services from 21 locations covering various urban and rural counties in North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia.

Approval of this petition would allow Liberty to apply for CON approval of a hospice agency in Hyde County. The safety and quality policies and procedures currently followed by Liberty Home Care would continue for those served in Hyde County. Liberty places a strong focus on the performance improvement and patient safety and makes every effort to ensure safe, positive patient outcomes and process standardization across the organization.

Access

As stated before, there is currently not a hospice agency located in Hyde County. Approval of this petition would allow Hyde County residents hospice services within their inhabited county. They would not have to rely on out-of-county agencies. Furthermore, Liberty has and will continue to serve any person without regard to age, sex, race, color, religion, or national origin.

Value

Liberty's current Home Care office in Hyde County would be the CON applicant should this petition be approved. Therefore, this will create the most cost effective solution for developing the proposed additional hospice agency, as this home care office is already established and asserted within the community. Furthermore, Liberty Home Care balances high quality care with cost savings initiatives as evidenced by the company's ability to continue to provide quality care while maneuvering through today's challenging healthcare world. The experience of the owners and the management team, as well as the strong support for its employees, indicate that Liberty Home Care is well qualified to provide hospice services to Hyde County residents.

Liberty Home Care's mission statement, "to provide cost effective, quality services that will achieve optimal outcomes," reflects the commitment of the company to providing quality home health and hospice services.

Conclusion

To conclude, Liberty Home care VII, LLC, d/b/a Liberty Home Care Services ("Liberty") seeks to expand hospice services in Hyde County and petitions for an adjusted need determination for an additional hospice home care agency in Hyde County in the 2018 SMFP. This petition has identified various circumstances in Hyde County that necessitate the development of an additional hospice home care agency. Liberty respectfully requests the Long-Term and Behavioral Health Committee and the State Health Coordinating Council include a need determination for an additional hospice home care agency in Hyde County in Hyde County in the 2018 SMFP.
