# Petition to the State Health Coordinating Council Adjustment to Need Determination for Cardiac Catheterization for New Hanover County 2023 State Medical Facilities Plan

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2. A statement of the requested adjustment, citing the provision of need determination within the Proposed SMFP for which the adjustment is proposed.

Novant Health New Hanover Regional Medical Center ("NH New Hanover") requests that the 2023 State Medical Facilities Plan ("SMFP") identify a need determination for zero (0) cardiac catheterization equipment in New Hanover County, as reflected in Table 17A-4.

As explained in this adjustment to need determination petition and the complementary adjustment to need determination petition Novant Health has submitted to add one unit of shared fixed cardiac catheterization equipment in Brunswick County, there is a need for additional cardiac catheterization services in southeastern North Carolina. The need, however, exists in Brunswick County, not New Hanover County. New Hanover County currently has five units of fixed cardiac catheterization equipment, with another unit approved pursuant to the need determination in the 2021 SMFP. Brunswick County does not have any fixed cardiac catheterization equipment. There is a clear imbalance that should be addressed, so that Brunswick County residents are not required to continue travelling out of county, and in some cases, out of state, to receive this life-saving treatment.

#### 3. Reasons for the proposed adjustment, including:

Novant Health Brunswick Medical Center ("NH Brunswick") is submitting an adjustment to need determination petition for shared cardiac catheterization equipment in Brunswick County in the 2023 SMFP. As explained this adjustment to need determination petition and the NH Brunswick adjustment to need determination petition, the need for an additional unit of fixed cardiac catheterization equipment exists in Brunswick County; New Hanover County has sufficient cardiac catheterization resources for the foreseeable future.

As stated in the aforementioned adjustment to need determination petition, Brunswick County has two acute care hospitals, NH Brunswick and J. Arthur Dosher Memorial Hospital, neither of these hospitals operate fixed cardiac catheterization equipment. DLP Cardiac Partners has operated mobile cardiac catheterization equipment on a limited bases (approximately 1 hour per week) over the past twelve years at NH Brunswick as the following table indicates:



The primary concern with mobile cardiac catheterization equipment is that based on NH New Hanover experience, nearly 50 percent of diagnostic cardiac catheterizations require a cardiac intervention and mobile cardiac catheterization equipment is not the preferred location to perform the cardiac intervention as the cardiac intervention is immediately performed after diagnosis and transferring delays treatment, which could be life threatening. Contracting for mobile cardiac catheterization services is also extremely expensive.

As such, essentially all Brunswick County cardiac catheterization patients are referred to and receive their cardiac catheterization procedure at Novant Health New Hanover Regional Medical Center ("NH New Hanover"). As the following graphic illustrates, patients from the eastern regions of Brunswick County seek cardiac catheterization services at NH New Hanover at a greater rate than those from the western regions due to travel distance and time. As an example, travelling from Carolina Shores in the 28467 Zip Code to NH New Hanover in Wilmington takes one hour to drive the 50 miles. This causes western region Brunswick County residents to seek treatment at South Carolina hospitals.

As the following table indicates, the number of Brunswick County patients receiving cardiac catheterization procedures at NH New Hanover has continued to increase annually since 2016, with only a 1.2 percent decrease in 2020 due to lingering COVID-19 pandemic issues.

For 2021-2026, Sg2 is projecting a 6% growth rate for inpatient diagnostic and interventional catheterization

As the following table highlights, in 2021, 52.7 percent  $[(1,297 / 2,462) \times 100]$  of diagnostic cardiac catheterization procedures at NH New Hanover were performed on Brunswick County residents, while 23.3 percent  $[(633 / 2,719) \times 100]$  of interventional cardiac catheterization procedures were performed on Brunswick County residents.

Additionally, based on the projected cardiac catheterization volumes included in CON Project ID# O-12112-21 and approved in February 2022, after accounting for a shift in cardiac catheterization volume to Brunswick County, NH New Hanover can accommodate the remaining cardiac catheterization procedures in its six cardiac catheterization labs, as the following table presents:

# b. A statement of the adverse effects on the population of the affected area that are likely to ensue if the adjustment is not made, and

Without approval of this petition, residents of Brunswick County must continue traveling to Wilmington or to South Carolina for their cardiac catheterization procedures. This only perpetuates the expense and inconvenience of traveling for a life-saving procedure that could safely be performed within Brunswick County, if appropriate cardiac catheterization equipment were available in Brunswick County.

c. A statement of alternatives to the proposed adjustment that were considered and found not feasible.

NH New Hanover does not believe an alternative exists to submitting this adjustment to need determination petition.

The cardiac catheterization procedures performed on Brunswick County patients are necessary for the volume projections for the success of any Brunswick County CON application for shared cardiac catheterization equipment.

4. Evidence that health service development permitted by the proposed adjustment would not result in unnecessary duplication of health resources in the area: and

Adjusting the need determination for one (1) unit of cardiac catheterization equipment in New Hanover County will most assuredly not result in duplication of health services in the area, but rather would allow for the development of cardiac catheterization services in Brunswick County, if the NH Brunswick adjustment to need determination petition is approved.

5. Evidence that the requested adjustment is consistent with the three Basic Principles governing the development of the SMFP: safety and quality, access and value.

The proposed adjustment is consistent with these basic principles in that safety and quality, access, and value, all of which are associated with the existing provision of cardiac catheterization services in New Hanoveroore County, will not be impacted. Based on the existing number of cardiac catheterization units in New Hanover County, patients from the NH New Hanover service area will continue to receive their cardiac catheterization procedures on six state-of-the-art cardiac catheterization units.

#### Conclusion

NH New Hanover believes that approving this adjustment to need determination petition in conjunction with the NH Brunswick adjustment to need determination petition will increase access to cardiac catheterization services in Brunswick County and strengthen the Novant Health goal to locate more healthcare specialty services in community hospitals, decreasing the necessity to travel to tertiary care facilities for those services, while not negatively impacting cardiac catheterization services in New Hanover County.
