The findings are:</p> <p>Observation on 7/29/19 at 11:50 A.M. of client #1's bedroom revealed: -Window blinds were missing holding clip to the wall and easily came off after trying to be opened.</p> <p>Observation on 7/29/19 at 11:55 A.M. of client #1's bathroom revealed: -Cabinet under hand sink was missing top drawer and was falling apart. -Window blinds behind tub were bent/broken.</p> <p>Observation on 7/29/19 at 12:00 P.M. of client #2's bedroom revealed: -Strong musky odor. -There was a a baseball size ball on the floor near the wall and behind bed's headboard. -Door from from entrance door was missing.</p>	V 736

Drywall and fixed patches were not painted.</p> <p>Observation on 7/29/19 at 12:13 P.M. of the back/side porch revealed: -There was a broken table tilted on its side.</p> <p>Observation on 7/29/19 at 12:18 P.M. of the front porch revealed: -Several poles/columns were rotten on the bottom.</p> <p>Interview on 7/29/19 with the Qualified Professional revealed: -He just recently started working as the QP at this house. -He was making a list of necessary repairs to be conducted at the home. -He was just made aware there was a hole on the floor of client #2's bedroom. It was unknown how it was created. -Broken table in the back/side porch was going to be thrown away. They had tried to fix it, but it was unsuccessful. -Facility was responsible for maintaining home and property. -He confirmed that facility grounds were not maintained in a clean, safe and attractive manner.</p>	V 736
