The program was not zoned for children, but 4 minors and 2 adults who would normally be in a school program had been attending the program Monday-Friday from 8:30 am to 2:30 pm to do virtual learning but were not considred clients of this program. There were treatment plans for 11 adult clients that indicated they needed one on one staffing or close monitoring due to histories of aggressive/violent behaviors and inappropriate sexualized behaviors. FC #6's treatment plan indicated he had a "history of sexual aggression which includes oral sex with a child." One staff was providing supervision to 6 clients who were in "virtual learning." Three of the 6 clients had residential treatment plans that indicated they required close monitoring or one on one staffing. This deficiency constitutes a Type A1 rule violation for serious neglect and must be corrected within 23 days. An administrative penalty of \$3,000 is imposed. If the violation is not corrected within 23 days, an additional administrative penalty of \$500.00 per day will be imposed for each day the facility is out of compliance beyond the 23rd day.

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
