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V 105	<p>Continued From page 1</p> <p>recommendations;</p> <p>(7) quality assurance and quality improvement activities, including:</p> <p>(A) composition and activities of a quality assurance and quality improvement committee;</p> <p>(B) written quality assurance and quality improvement plan;</p> <p>(C) methods for monitoring and evaluating the quality and appropriateness of client care, including delineation of client outcomes and utilization of services;</p> <p>(D) professional or clinical supervision, including a requirement that staff who are not qualified professionals and provide direct client services shall be supervised by a qualified professional in that area of service;</p> <p>(E) strategies for improving client care;</p> <p>(F) review of staff qualifications and a determination made to grant treatment/habilitation privileges;</p> <p>(G) review of all fatalities of active clients who were being served in area-operated or contracted residential programs at the time of death;</p> <p>(H) adoption of standards that assure operational and programmatic performance meeting applicable standards of practice. 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V 105	<p>Continued From page 2</p> <p>This Rule is not met as evidenced by: Based on record review and interview, the facility failed to develop and implement adoption of standards that ensured operational and programmatic performance meeting applicable standards of practice for random drug testing instrument including the CLIA (Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments) waiver. The findings are:</p> <p>The facility presented no evidence of a CLIA Waiver.</p> <p>Observation on 4/7/22 of the facility's drug testing kits revealed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-There was a clear cup that labeled the group of different drugs.</li> <li>-Client's had to dispensed urine in the clear cup.</li> <li>-After clients dispensed in the cup, they would pull the strip to show the results.</li> <li>-The results identified positive or negative and what drug was in the client's system.</li> <li>-The alcohol kit was a 4-minute screening test.</li> <li>-Client's would put the strip in their mouth and wait 4 minutes to check the results.</li> </ul> <p>Interview on 4/7/22 with the Program Director revealed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Confirmed the facility conducted random drug and alcohol test.</li> <li>-Every client admitted and attended the program received a random drug and alcohol test.</li> <li>-Clients that returned after a 24 and 48 hours leave pass was tested.</li> <li>-Confirmed there was no evidence the facility had a CLIA Waiver.</li> </ul>	V 105
