10	(6)	have supply of bath soap, clean towels, washcloths, sheets, pillow cases, blankets, and additional
11		coverings adequate for resident use on hand at all times;
12	<u>(7)</u>	make available the following items as needed through any means other than charge to the personal
13		<u>funds:</u>
14		(A) protective sheets and clean, absorbent, soft and smooth pads;
15		(B) bedpans, urinals, hot water bottles, and ice caps; and
16		(C) bedside commodes, walkers, and wheelchairs.
17	(8)	have television and radio, each in good working order;
18	<u>(9)</u>	have curtains, draperies or blinds at windows in resident use areas to provide for resident privacy;
19	(10)	have recreational equipment, supplies for games, books, magazines and a current newspaper
20		available for residents;
21	(11)	have a clock that has numbers at least 1½ inches tall in an area commonly used by the residents;
22		<u>and</u>
23	(12)	have at least one telephone that does not depend on electricity or cellular service to operate.
24	(b) Each bedroor	n shall have the following furnishings in good repair and clean for each resident:
25	<u>(1)</u>	Beds shall be equipped with box springs and mattress or solid link springs and no-sag innerspring
26		or foam mattress. A hospital bed shall be arranged for as needed. A water bed is allowed if
27		requested by a resident and permitted by the program. Each bed shall have the following:
28		(A) at least one pillow with clean pillow case;
29		(B) clean top and bottom sheets on the bed, with bed changed as often as necessary but at
30		least once a week; and
31		(C) clean bedspread and other clean coverings as needed.
32	(2)	a bedside type table;
33	(3)	chest of drawers or bureau when not provided as built-ins, or a double chest of drawers or double
34		dresser for two residents;
35	(4)	a wall or dresser mirror that can be used by each resident;
36	<u>(5)</u>	a minimum of one comfortable chair (rocker or straight, arm or without arms, as preferred by
37	207	resident), high enough from floor for easy rising;
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1	<u>(6)</u>	additional chairs available, as needed, for use by visitors;
2	<u>(7)</u>	individual clean towel, wash cloth, and towel bar within bedroom or adjoining bathroom; and
3	<u>(8)</u>	a light overhead of bed with a switch within reach of person lying on bed; or a lamp. The light
4		shall provide a minimum of 30 foot-candle power of illumination for reading.
5	(c) The living r	room shall have functional living room furnishings for the comfort of aged and disabled persons, with
6	coverings that a	re easily cleanable.
7	(d) The dining	room shall have the following furnishings:
8	<u>(1)</u>	tables and chairs to seat all residents eating in the dining room; and
9	<u>(2)</u>	chairs that are sturdy, non-folding, without rollers unless retractable or on front legs only, and
10		designed to minimize tilting.
