6	(a) All adult day care programs offering overnight respite services shall develop and implement policies and
7	procedures on resident medication use, medication administration, order changes and medication disposal.
8	(b) Medications shall be administered according to the resident's medication schedule. The medication schedule
9	shall list all medications with dosages and times medications are to be administered.
10	(c) A record of all medications given to each participant shall be updated as needed and shall document the
11	following:
12	(1) resident's name;
13	(2) name, dosage, quantity and route of the medication;
14	(3) instructions for giving medication;
15	(4) date and time medication is administered; and
16	(5) name or initials of person giving the medication. If initials are used, a signature equivalent to those
17	initials shall be entered on this record.
18	(d) Medications shall be kept in the original pharmacy containers in which they were dispensed. The containers
19	shall be labeled with the resident's full name, the name and strength of the medicine, and dosage and instructions for
20	administration. Medicines shall be kept in a locked location.
21	(e) Only adult day health or adult day care and day health combination programs shall enroll or serve residents who
22	require intravenous, intramuscular or subcutaneous medications while attending the program.
23	(f) If the staff person administering medications is not a licensed health professional, a registered nurse must
24	perform and document validation of each staff person's competency to administer medications before administering
25	medications.
26	(g) A licensed health professional must be available for consultation with staff if needed and shall be documented.
